Every British bank, being a limited banking company, shall forthwith forward or cause to be forwarded to the Registrar of Companies one copy of every statement which such bank shall make in compliance with the requirements to section one hundred and eight of the Companies (Consolidated) Act, 1908 (8 Edw. 7, C. 69).

Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace :—

List and summary to be sent by British bank.

33. Every British bank, being a company under the aforesaid Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, and having a share capital shall forthwith forward or cause to be forwarded to the Registrar of Companies one copy of every list and summary which such bank shall make in compliance with section twenty-six of the aforesaid Companies (Consolidated) Act, 1908.

A Bill to Amend the Bank Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows: —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Bank (Amend-Short title. ment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Bank Ordinance (Chapter 94 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 32 of the Principal Ordinance as amended by Amendment the Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, is hereby further of the amended by deleting therefrom the words:—

"to section one hundred and eight of the Companies No. 5 of 1927 (Consolidation) Act, 1908 (8 Edw. 7, c. 69) "

and by substituting therefor the following words:—

"of section one hundred and thirty-one of the Companies Act, 1929."

3. Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance as amended Repeal and by the Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

"33. Every British bank being a company under the Return to be Companies Act, 1929, and having a share capital, shall sent by forthwith forward or cause to be forwarded to the bank. Registrar of Companies one copy of every return which such bank shall make in compliance with sections one hundred and eight and one hundred and ten of the said Companies Act, 1929."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is designed to amend two sections of the Bank Ordinance, which contain references to certain sections of the repealed Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908.

The sections to which reference is so made are changed to the corresponding sections of the Companies Act, 1929.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

LOCUST REPORT, 19TH APRIL, 1984.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Flying locusts are still to be found scattered in various parts of the Kwale district, but no further reports of laying or hatching have been received.

Owing to the timely assistance rendered by the Agricultural Staff at Moshi, the hoppers in the populated areas around Taveta appear to have been largely exterminated.

Masai-Machakos Area.—Heavy local thunderstorms have already accelerated hatchings in the Matiliku district and fresh emergences are taking place daily. The Locust Officer reports that swatting and burning are the methods now in force, the hoppers being still too young for baiting. Plentiful supplies of poison bait are at hand on the spot, and will be employed as soon as the local circumstances warrant this method. As this infestation is still in the early stage it is not yet possible to say whether the position will become of serious importance or not.

As regards the Masai area, and more particularly the southerly portions of the reserve, very few reports are obtainable from those parts, and it has therefore been considered advisable to organize a scouting campaign, and a Locust Officer is now engaged on an expedition from Lake Natron to the Mara River to investigate the position as regards possible hatchings in that part of the country. This scouting organization will be extended as necessity arises.

Sotik-Kisii Area.—An extension of the infestation reported last week has to be recorded across the Masai border in the vicinity of the Mara River. Hatchings covering several square miles of territory have taken place, and an officer is now at work dealing with the outbreak; reports of the progress of this campaign are not yet to hand, but all necessary equipment and bait are on the spot.

Kisii reports that since the breaking of the rains recently there has been an increase in the number of hoppers in the Majoge district, but it is thought that hatching is now complete. Hopper bands about 10 or 15 yards in diameter are fairly numerous and while these have been dealt with so far by beating only, it is considered that baiting and spraying will be necessary before control can be established. Sufficient supplies and equipment are available in Kisii for present needs.

The Migratory Locust.

From Butere it is reported that a small swarm is now laying in that district, but that for the present no importance need be attached to this small infestation. No damage to crops is reported.

General.—With the advent of rain in certain districts hopper emergences have, as anticipated, taken place in most of the affected areas and are still in progress. So far it has been found possible to deal with every hatching as reported, but it must be borne in mind that there still remain large tracts of country over which layings have occurred, but from which no hatching reports have been received. The whole position will, therefore, still require careful watching.
