LOCUST REPORT, 10TH MAY, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Emergences are still in progress in most areas and are reported from as far north as Kipini, and along the Tana River, where birds are reported to be doing good work near Golbanti. Heavy hatchings have taken place in the Kilifi area and a baiting campaign is being organized. Hatchings are also reported over a considerable portion of the Mombasa district, but the position there is not regarded as serious.

A special Locust Officer has been appointed to supervise the work in the Coast area, but his reports on the situation are not yet to hand.

Machakos-Masai Area.—Satisfactory progress is reported from Mataliko where all the first hatchings have been eliminated, but the irregularity of the rainfall has delayed hatchings in some parts and reports of fresh emergences are coming in daily. The experimental baiting on selected areas has proved very effective, the locust officer reporting that a 100 per cent kill was registered. Baiting operations will therefore be gradually extended to other areas, and it is hoped that it will be possible to announce shortly that the situation in the whole of the Machakos district is under control.

No further reports have been received from the Kajiado-Laitokitok country, but as it is anticipated that hatchings will have taken place scouts are being sent out to report any developments.

Kisii-Narok Area.—The control officer sent up to Kisii last week reports that the whole of the infested area is now under close supervision and that the work of destruction is progressing satisfactorily. Owing to the very wide extent of the scattered hatchings it has not yet been possible to investigate and report upon each district separately, but an adequate intelligence service is being arranged and every outbreak will be dealt with as soon as reported. An intensive destruction campaign is also now being conducted in the Kisii border-Mara River country, where it is anticipated that control will shortly be established.

Scouting operations in the Masai Reserve have revealed considerable hatchings between Narok and the Tanganyika border, some of the hoppers being in their fourth moult and therefore approaching the flying stage. Immediate steps have been taken to deal with these bands and further scouting expeditions have been organized to cover areas from which no reports have as yet been received.

General.—Daily hatchings continue in all districts and the campaign net-work is being gradually extended to cover each fresh emergency; all that can be said at present is that the general situation is no worse than last week.

TANGANYIKA TERRITORY.

Dar es Salaam reports numerous small flying swarms damaging young crops. Swarms continue to move northwards.

Bagamoyo.—Work continues against hoppers and flyers, and the northerly movement is marked. Weather conditions immobilize flyers long enough for considerable destruction to be effected. A large swarm has arisen and is now in the region of Sadani, doing very little damage.

Tanga Province.—In the Jipe area considerable damage has been done to young cotton by hoppers, whilst in the Lushoto district no damage is reported and hoppers are confined to the plains. Muhesa hopper situation causing anxiety but energetic action Handeni reports hopper damage proceeding. negligible except in Kimbe, and flyers are appearing.

Northern Province.—Further hatching, reported from Uru, is being dealt with. The position in the Moshi district is greatly easier, whilst active operations are taking place in Sanya, Kibongoto and Kingori and concentrated action is there being taken.

In Arusha there are widely separated bands, work is being undertaken around Mondul. Hopper bands reported from various parts of Masailand show heavy natural mortality. Hoppers in Mbulu are found only near Oldeani. Escapes are anticipated from remote areas.

General.—The continuation of the rains and overcast skies in the Eastern Province has checked the movement of the small escape flying swarms. In the south movement may be anticipated as the weather clears, and unfortunately as expected the movement so far is in a northerly direction, which will bring these swarms up to the Usambaras in time. Immunity from serious damage for three weeks in the south will render the food crop situation secure, as also in the western and Lake Provinces. Continuation of the rains will provide natural green food for locusts for a lower period in the bush, thus lessening the risk to crops. So far as may be ascertained the flying swarms in the Territory to-day are very much smaller than at one time seemed likely.

within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days from demand, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) General.

- 1. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 2. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Authority, and by the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani, for necessary action.

2. In no case shall the area of any plot used solely for business purposes required to remain unbuilt on be less than 300 square feet, and that the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto, and in accordance with a design approved by the Authority.

Such open space shall be at the rear of the building, and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than 10 feet.

3. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a

building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations.

4. At no time during the term of the grant shall any plot or any portion thereof, or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been

or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.

5. Verandas may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the Authority, and must conform to a building line decided upon by such Authority.


