RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

Since the last Rabies Progress Report was issued on 27th March, three positive cases have been confirmed: one case in a jackal, which was notified in the last report as being highly suspicious on a Songhor farm, has since been confirmed as positive; one occurred in a jackal on an estate at Muhoroni, and the other a jackal in the Eldoret District.

Poison baiting has been carried out in these districts with fairly satisfactory results, and is being continued in the Kiberi, Malama and Terikis Locations of the North Kavirondo Native Reserve.

Suspicious cases have occurred in the Kipkarren area, but unfortunately no material was available for diagnosis.

On the other hand, it is satisfactory to report that it has been found possible, owing to the non-existence of rabies for over eight months, to revoke the rabies quarantine regulations in force in South Lumbwa Administrative District and South Kavirondo Native Reserve and District as from 9th May, 1934.

LOCUST REPORT, 17TH MAY, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Hoppers have now hatched out in the Digo, Mombasa, Kilfi, Malindi and Kipini districts and it will therefore be seen that practically the whole of the coastal belt is infested. At present the hopper bands are scattered and are being actively attacked by beating, baiting and spraying. The rains experienced at the coast have militated against the employment of the last two methods in most districts but they will be resumed as soon as weather permits. The infestation along the whole coastal strip is heavy but a large force of natives under the direction of the administrative officers and a special locust officer are doing everything possible to control the situation.

From Voi it is reported that fresh hatchings have occurred in parts of the Teita Reserve and also at Mkameni and Mashoti. While hoppers are heaviest at Bura they are as yet nowhere on a large scale. Beating and burning have been the more generally adopted measures and have proved efficacious, while baiting has also met with some success. Most of the locations so far dealt with are now reported to be almost free of hoppers.

Machakos Masai Area.—The officer operating in the Machakos district reports that hoppers are still numerous and daily hatchings are in progress. While beating is the principal method employed, buting on a small scale has also been carried out with considerable success, even where succulent grass was present. Heavy hatchings have been reported from Mukaa and the officer in charge is proceeding to that centre to investigate and organize destruction. The campaign in the Machakos area has now been in operation for over five weeks and while great progress has been made the delayed hatchings have caused very strenuous work. Much active exertion will still be required before the situation can be described as under control.

While a careful watch is being kept over the Kajiado-Loitokitok region, things are still very quiet and no hatchings of any importance have been reported, the small emergences which have occurred having been easily dealt with locally, with some assistance from birds.

infestation Kisii-Narok Area.—The heaviest appears now to be in the Trans Mara area, and energetic measures have been adopted to deal with the very numerous and daily increasing hopper These are now on the march and moving in a north-westerly direction, considerable numbers have already penetrated into the adjoining Kisii country, but so far the only damage reported is a few acres of wimbi consumed. In South Kavirondo some of the locations previously reported as being heavily infested have been dealt with and are now practically clear of hoppers, but fairly extensive areas still remain covered with scattered bands, which, under the supervision of the locust officer in charge, are being gradually exterminated.

The campaign at Sianna, some 40 miles from Narok, is progressing satisfactorily, but further hatchings have occurred south of Sianna towards the Tanganyika border, and the honorary locust officer in charge has extended his activities to these

new positions, his campaign has, in fact, penetrated to some five miles on the Tanganyika side of the border.

Continual scouting over the whole of this part of the Masai Reserve is being conducted with the very helpful co-operation of the local administrative officer, and this measure should ensure that no bands in the whole of this area shall escape attention

While there is no cause for alarm, the whole position in the South Kavirondo and Masai Reserves must be regard as serious until considerable further progress has been made with the work of destruction. The field officers have great distances to cover, and it is only by constant vigilance that fresh hatchings are detected. It should be placed on record that any success which has so far been achieved is very largely due to the courteous and hearty co-operation of the permanent administrative officers in the affected districts.

Sporadic hatchings have been reported from the neighbourhood of the Kano Reserve; these are at present not serious and are being dealt with by beating and spraying.

General.—Hopper emergences have now been in progress for some seven weeks, but it is hoped that finality of hatchings is being approached, in view of the continued and general rains. Practically all flyers appear to have died out and none are now reported from any district. As soon as reports of fresh hatchings cease to be daily occurrences it will be possible to estimate the extent of the whole infestation. A constant watch is being maintained over every theatre of operations and suspected area, and it is not anticipated that hatchings of any magnitude can occur without immediate reports of such emergences being received, when the present organization admits of being extended to any necessary limits.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE. (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition.)

SALE OF GRANT OF PLOT No. 1297, ELIOT STREET, NAIROBI (THE Y.M.C.A. PLOT).

NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that the grant in respect of Plot No. 1297, Eliot Street (known as the Y.M.C.A. Plot), Nairobi, together with the buildings erected thereon, will be sold by auction at the office of the District Commissioner, Nairobi, on Tuesday, the 26th June, 1934, commencing at 11 a.m.

A plan showing the position of the plot may be seen at the Public Map Office attached to the Survey and Registration Division, Government Road, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner, at Nairobi, or may be had on application to the Commissioner of Lands, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.

The right to withdraw the plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

Conditions of Sale.

- 1. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 2. The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arises as to any bid, the plot will be re-offered at the last undisputed bid.
- 3. The purchaser shall pay to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25 per cent of the purchase money. In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 4. The purchaser shall, on paying the deposit, inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased; the grant will be issued in accordance with this information.
- 5. The balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, within seven days of the sale.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the period stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant of the plot duly executed.

And further provided that, if the purchaser so elect, the balance of purchase money may be paid in three equal annual instalments, subject to interest at the rate of 6 per centum per annum on the outstanding balance, the first of such instalments to be paid, together with the interest that shall have accrued due, on the 1st July, 1935, and thereafter instalments to be paid on the 1st July in each year.

6. The rent due to the 31st December, 1934, shall be payable to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, within seven days of the request therefor.

The survey fees (Sh. 80), the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant, shall be payable to the Commissioner of Lands, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi; these amounts to be paid within seven days of a request therefor.

- 7. Subject to the provisos contained in condition No. 5, if the amounts mentioned are not paid as therein specified, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the plot.
- 8. The purchaser of the plot shall within twelve months of the commencement of his grant submit to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, a plan of the building it is proposed to erect upon the Fifth Avenue frontage of the plot. The purchaser shall also submit to the Town Clerk, plans of all alterations or new buildings to be constructed on the remainder of the plot. Such plans shall conform in architectural design to the amenities of the neighbourhood. The buildings shall be constructed of stone, burnt brick, or concrete, on proper foundations. The purchaser, when submitting the plans, shall state in writing the period in which the proposed building shall be completely erected.

The buildings to be erected on the plot must be of not less than two stories in height, and must be of a value of not less than Cents 90 per cubic foot of building content.

The Commissioner of Lands, or such other person as he may appoint for the purpose, shall within one month of the approval of the plan by the Nairobi Municipal Council, notify the purchaser of his approval or otherwise of the plans, and shall also notify the date by which such buildings shall be erected. If the erection of the buildings in accordance with the approved plans and specifications be not completed by the prescribed date, the said Commissioner may, on good and reasonable cause being shown, grant such extension as he may deem sufficient, subject to such conditions as he may prescribe. Provided that if the purchaser shall receive no intimation from the Commissioner within one month of the date on which the plans have been approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council, he may proceed with the erection of the building in accordance with the plans submitted, and the Commissioner shall not have the power to cause to be made any alteration or variation in the plan or the date.

- 9. Subject to the proviso contained in clause 8 hereof, no building shall be erected on the plot unless plans (including a block plan showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action.
- 10. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign any such subdivision without the consent in writing of the Governor.
- 11. At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
