LOCUST REPORT, 31st MAY, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—The hopper infestation at the coast has now proved to be of a serious nature, and an emergency force of European officers with full equipment has been put into the field to direct operations. A very large number of natives is actively engaged on the work of destruction, and it has been found necessary and advisable, with the co-operation of the Administration, to temporarily convert all famine relief organizations in infested areas to purposes of locust control.

Willing co-operation has also been enlisted from the Principal of the Government School at Waa, from the Methodist School at Kaloleni and from the Public Works Department officials in the area. As the whole organization is only in its preliminary stages no estimate is as yet available regarding the whole extent of the infested area, nor as to the prospects of control.

The heaviest infestation appears to extend from Gazi to Kilifi on the coast and to perhaps thirty miles inland. Some of the bands observed are in the fourth moult and will therefore, in the ordinary course, reach the flying stage in some two or three weeks' time. The position at Samburu, where a heavy infestation was reported, is easier and if no fresh hatchings occur, control is well in sight in that district.

From Malindi hatchings have been reported from most of the surrounding locations, some of which are already cleared. Beating operations are proceeding energetically against the remaining bands of hoppers.

Machakos-Masai Area.—Good progress in the work of destruction is reported, and while a few small and isolated emergences have occurred it is now clear that hatchings are practically finished. As a result of the enormous destruction which has been in progress in this district for nine weeks it can now be said that the position is under control.

Kisii-Narok Area.—The latest reports from these districts also indicate that hatchings are complete. There are still very many small bands scattered over a large area of country; these are being gradually and systematically exterminated, and very few, if any, escapes should occur.

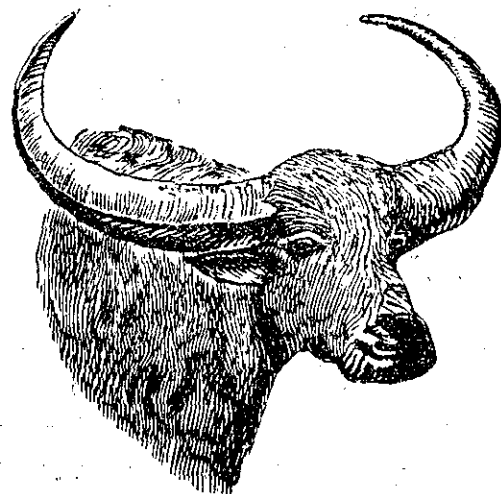
