## THE MINING IN PROCLAIMED AREAS ORDINANCE, 1933.

IT is notified for general information that Government is prepared to receive applications from companies, syndicates or individuals for exclusive prospecting licences over the whole or part of the area (1 mile strip of Yala River) reserved in section 2 of the second schedule to Government Notice No. 286 of the 17th April.

In accordance with section 17 of the Mining Ordinance, 1933, applications must be in the prescribed form and applicants must give evidence of sufficient capital to ensure proper prospecting and must furnish details of the methods which they propose to pursue if their application is granted. Licences will be granted for one year but may be renewed at the discretion of the Governor for further terms of one year up to a maximum of five years on submission of a programme of further development.

A fee of £20 per square mile as prescribed by the Mining in Proclaimed Areas Ordinance, 1933, will be payable in addition to any fees payable under the Mining Ordinance, 1933.

Applications accompanied by the appropriate fees should be in the hands of the Commissioner of Mines on or before the 31st July, 1934.

Applicants are warned that the area is liable to be infected with trypanosomiasis (sleeping sickness) and that special health precautions as directed by the Medical Officer of Health must be taken by the successful applicant or applicants.

## LOCUST REPORT, 14TH JUNE, 1934.

## KENYA.

*The Red Locust.*

*Coast Province.*—The continuous and torrential rains at the coast have militated very strongly against the effective conduct of the campaign. At Ramisi, for instance, a rainfall of over 30 inches has been recorded during the past five weeks, and many parts of the coastal belt have been inundated and consequently rendered inaccessible. While the work

of destruction has been very seriously delayed over the whole area it has been brought to a complete standstill in some districts.

It will be realized, therefore, that little actual progress can be anticipated until better weather conditions prevail, nevertheless the destruction campaign is being steadily and energetically pursued in all accessible areas.

From the Kwale district a fresh emergence of considerable extent has been reported and is being dealt with and it would appear doubtful whether hatchings at the coast are as yet complete, reports from various centres indicating that many hopper bands are still only in their first or second stages.

Reports of damage to crops are becoming more frequent. In addition to those already recorded news is now to hand that the hoppers are attacking the sugar cane in large numbers and to an appreciable extent, and from Gazi it is reported that 100 acres of sisal have been severely damaged. Spraying in the cane plantations with a dilute solution of arsenite has been found to be most effective, in some cases a 100 per cent kill having been registered without causing any damage to the cane. Further damage to native crops is also reported from various districts, and it is understood that at the leper colony at Msambweni the crops have suffered heavily.

The honorary locust officer operating at Ramisi in the neighbouring native reserves reports that fresh hatchings and invasions have necessitated much repetition of work on parts of the sugar estates which had previously been cleared, and that in the adjacent reserves beaters have been busy killing hoppers at Bodo Sharizi and Dalgube but owing to the river being impassable it has been impossible to inspect the more distant locations. In view of the fact that all the above country is now largely under water and quite unapproachable by ordinary transport a foot safari through the territory lying between the Ramisi river and the Tanganyika border has been arranged in order to get work started and some knowledge of the true position in that part of the country.

Destruction has been progressing satisfactorily in the Tiwi, Diani, Waa and Ngombani districts, but there are several large bands to be dealt with in this neighbourhood and particularly on the property of certain private estates. Except perhaps on the last-named land it is confidently anticipated that control will be established before the flying stage is reached.

Poison bait has been found very effective in the Waa district despite the heavy rains, it is most successful when the hoppers are in their fourth and fifth stage. In the vicinity of Kwale numbers of hoppers have completed their last moult and are now in the preliminary flying stage.

In the Mazaras-Kaloleni area the work of destruction has, in common with all other districts, been seriously hampered by the climatic conditions, but as the campaign in this area was started while the hoppers were still small it is hoped that, with the ready assistance of the local Missions and the native chiefs, it will still be possible to establish control provided that a period of finer weather ensues.

Mombasa reports that Likoni and Mtongwe areas are now definitely clear of hoppers, and that no damage to crops has been reported from these districts.

The coastal strip from Mombasa to Malindi, and extending some ten miles inland, has on investigation, been found to be entirely free from locusts, and scouting in a suspected area in the vicinity of Ganza, to the north-west of Malindi on the Sabaki river, is in progress. No further locations in the Malindi district have been infested and the swatting campaign has more than kept pace with the emergencies in the affected locations.

**Machakos Area.**—After nearly three months of concentrated work in this area it can now be definitely stated that with the exception of a few small bands in the Mbuni district, the whole infestation has been satisfactorily dealt with. The whole area covered by the Nzaui, Mbitini, Mukaa and Mataliku locations, which at one time were all heavily infested, has now been completely cleaned up. The work and willing co-operation of the native chiefs in the affected areas cannot be too highly commended, and it is entirely due to their unremitting efforts, under the supervision of the European locust officer, that success has been achieved.

**Kisii-Narok Area.**—There is little change in the general situation to report. The Trans Mara area where the daily hopper invasions of the South Kavirondo country chiefly emanated, is being drastically dealt with, although it is hoped that control can shortly be established at the moment the position is slightly doubtful and no definite statement can be made.

**General.**—While the coastal infestation is definitely of a serious nature and threatens to become a potential menace, it is satisfactory to be able to record that it is now fairly certain that no anxiety need be felt as regards an invasion of the settled areas from any of the other infested districts in the Colony.

It is perhaps necessary to place on record that the general infestation up-country, i.e. in the Machakos, Masai and South Kavirondo reserves has proved to be certainly not comparable in extent or severity with the very heavy outbreaks of previous years. But it is principally due to the fact that timely information received from those districts enabled immediate steps to be taken to deal with the outbreaks in their early stages that we have not been faced with the menace of large flying swarms invading the settled areas. And though these swarms would not, admittedly, have attained such vast dimensions as some of those of the past five years, it will be borne in mind that a fairly extensive swarm can do a vast amount of damage in a very short while. But if the danger has been averted up-country the present position at the coast cannot be regarded lightly. Unfortunately the weather conditions since the campaign started have been so deplorable that much very valuable time has been irretrievably lost, which is the more regrettable as many of the hoppers had already reached an advanced stage before the serious work of their destruction commenced. Several competent authorities agree that the coastal infestation is, in many parts at any rate comparable in density to some of the heavy up-country outbreaks of the past few years, and from this fact, combined with the atrocious climatic conditions, it will be realized that the establishment of control will, at best, be a difficult process. It should be stressed, however, that there is no cause for alarm; the large force of European

officers, native chiefs and labourers now vigorously working on destruction will, it is hoped, succeed in reducing the damage and escapes to a minimum.

#### TANGANYIKA.

The following are extracts from a report received from Tanganyika Territory under date 2nd June, 1934:—

#### Eastern Province.

**Das es Salaam.**—No further reports of damage to crops received, and some flyers have entered Baganoyo but in the south of the district they are dying off rapidly. The hopper campaign is finished.

**Morogoro.**—The hopper campaign is now finished, the last surviving band being destroyed half way up the Uluguru Mountains. Six flying swarms have been reported, three of them passing Morogoro where some small damage has been done to cotton and millet. Damage has also been done at Matombo and at Mlela. Three of the swarms were large covering 8 to 10 square miles when in flight but they could not be considered dense. The flying swarms appear to come in from the south and west and move north-east towards the Bagamoyo district. Natives defended their crops with success.

**Lindi Province.**—Reports scattered swarms of flyers in the game reserve, whilst Songea observes numbers of swarms crossing the valley of the Rovuma and moving north. So far there is no report from Lindi, Masasi or Tunduru notifying the arrival of these swarms.

**Northern Province.**—Hoppers occur in scattered bands throughout the Arusha and Moshi districts. Fungus is reported as causing the death of a small percentage of hoppers. Five power spray units are working.

Escapes are reported from Loliondo from uninhabited country, parties from Kenya operated this side of the border to a depth of some miles.

#### Tanga Province.

**Handeni.**—Reports small patches of flying locusts. Many of these patches will succumb to disease as it has been found along the border of Morogoro, Bagamoyo and Handeni.

**General.**—It may now be stated with considerable certainty that the generation of flyers which has arisen as a result of the layings of December-March, is of very moderate dimensions indeed, and does not, in my opinion, constitute a serious menace. The fungus disease has now been reported from practically every district. High natural mortality is being observed constantly.

The food-crop situation is considered to be almost safe, so far as locusts are concerned, in all provinces save the Northern and Tanga, where crops are still vulnerable. Mtama is likely to be damaged in the Eastern Province, but if natives will continue to defend their plots as they are doing, losses will not be heavy. In the Eastern Province, cotton damaged earlier in the season in most instances has recovered, and even recently damaged cotton will recover. Further damage cannot fail to occur, but it will be on a small scale.

If the Territory is not seriously invaded from the south, there need be little fear, but the news from the Rovuma is not reassuring.
