thence in a north-easterly direction following the eastern boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3500 to the point where that boundary meets the Thaba River;

thence in an easterly direction following the northern bank of the Thaba River to the point where the Thaba River meets the Tana or Kiloluma River, the point of commencement, to be an infected area (Trypanosomiasis).

LONDIANI-JUNCTION CAMP (TOWARDS LAKE NARASHA) ROAD.

ORDER.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance, Chapter 113 of the Revised Edition, as amended by the Revised Edition of the Laws (Operation) Ordinance, 1926, it is enacted *inter alia* that, whenever it is made to appear to the Governor that requirements exist for the establishment of a line of public travel, the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, dedicate a line of public travel and from such date of publication such line of public travel shall be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public road within the meaning of any law for the time being in force:

LOCUST REPORT, 26TH JULY, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—It is reported from Malindi that some parts of that district are still thickly infested with young hoppers. In all the other affected areas at the coast there are very numerous groups of young flyers, and while every effort is being made to protect crops a certain amount of damage is reported, particularly from the Malindi district, where considerable damage to maize shambas and banana plantations has taken place.

Nyanza Province.—The influx of flying swarms into the South Kavirondo Reserve from the south has now practically ceased. The course of the invading swarms has been generally Kisii-Kericho-Mau Forest, and the latest observations appear to show that their further movement is in a southerly direction towards the Masai country.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

5. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 4, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days of a demand therefor, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

6. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descrip-

tions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

7. Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term will be 99 years from the 1st day of September, 1934.

8. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.

9. The plot and the buildings to be erected thereon shall be used for the sole purpose of the retail sale of petrol and motor accessories, and shall not be used for residential purposes.

10. Each purchaser will be required to erect on his plot within six months of the date of the approval of his plans a building of approved design constructed of stone, brick or concrete.

11. The scheme of building and the general layout of the plot shall be approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council, and no buildings shall be erected on any plot unless and until plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall have been previously approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council and the Commissioner of Lands (or such other person as he shall appoint), and until the general layout shall have been approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council.

Plans, etc., shall in the first instance be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action, such submission to be within one month of the date of the commencement of the grant.

12. The building shall not be of more than one story in height.

13. Verandas shall not be erected outside the boundaries of the plot.

14. Where necessary an area surrounding the plot will be vested in the Municipal Council in order that the plot may be surrounded by suitable horticultural treatment.

15. The grantee will be required to pave with bitumen-bound macadam, such portions of the unplanted and unbuilt upon area within the boundaries of the plot as stipulated by the Municipal Council and maintain the same to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands. The Nairobi Municipal Council will undertake this macadam construction and maintenance on behalf of the purchaser who will be responsible for the cost, which shall be payable to the Municipal Council within seven days of demand.

16. The Nairobi Municipal Council will construct and maintain the road areas from the boundaries of the alienated plot to the main road in the vicinity of the plot to a bitumen-bound macadam standard.

17. Under the provisions of section 60 (b) of the Crown Lands Ordinance, the grantee will be required to pay the Municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plot. A clause will, therefore, be embodied in the grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.
