SUPPLEMENT

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

Gratuity to estate where a non-European officer dies in the service.

17. Where a non-European officer holding a pensionable office who is not on probation or agreement dies while in the service of Kenya, and during the five years preceding his death has continuously held pensionable office in Kenya or offices in other public service which were, when he held them, pensionable under the pensions regulations applicable to such service, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, to grant to his legal personal representative a gratuity of an amount not exceeding one year's pensionable emoluments.

A Bill to Amend the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Non-European Short title. Officers' Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the Principal No. 53 of 1932. Ordinance.

2. Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by the renumbering of the section as section 17 (1) and by the addition of the following as sub-section (2):-

"(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Gratuity not Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1926, or the Public Trustee's Ordinance, 1925, no gratuity granted or Public under sub-section (1) hereof shall be subject to any estate Trustee's fees. under sub-section (1) hereof shall be subject to any estate duty or to the payment of the Public Trustee's fees or No. 7 of 1925. charges."

Principal Ordinance. to be subject.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of the Bill is to provide expressly that a gratuity granted under section 17 of the Principal Ordinance to the legal representative of a deceased officer shall not be subject to the payment of estate duty or the Public Trustee's fees and charges.

No expenditure of public money will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law, but a small loss of revenue, the amount of which will be negligible, will result.

KENYA AND UGANDA RAILWAYS AND HARBOURS.

TENDERS FOR THE SUPPLY OF WOOD FUEL.

TENDERS are invited for the supply to the Locomotive Shed at Kilindini of approximately 20,000 cubic feet of Hardwood fuel per month, to be cut as near Mombasa as possible.

Any royalties due to Government will be deducted by the Administration from payments due in respect of fuel delivered.

A security deposit or bank guarantee of Sh. 1,000 will be required for the due performance of the contract, and also a further security deposit or bank guarantee of Sh. 1,000 for safeguarding the payment of native wages.

The form of agreement required to be entered into may be seen at the offices of the District Locomotive Superintendent, Kilindini, and of the Chief Mechanical Engineer, Nairobi.

Tenders must specify the price per 100 cubic feet of Hardwood fuel cut and stacked as specified in the aforementioned agreement, the price to be inclusive of Government royalty, if any is payable, and must also state the area in which the fuel will be cut, i.e., whether Crown Land, Forest Reserve or Private Land and mileage on the Railway at which it will be loaded. Tenderers must ascertain what royalty, if any, is payable and state same in the tender.

The successful tenderer will be required to commence cutting and deliveries immediately the contract is settled.

Sealed tenders marked "Tenders for Wood Fuel" must reach the Chairman, Tender Board, Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, P.O. Box 570, Nairobi, not later than 12 noon on Monday the 27th August, 1934. The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

LOCUST REPORT, 2ND AUGUST, 1934.

KENYA.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—The main feature of reports received during the week from the coast is the massing of the various small groups of flyers into swarms with a definite north-westerly movement. As yet no prolonged flights have been observed, the numerous groups contenting themselves with circling about during the day and massing into dense swarms when settling for the night. These scattered groups of flyers are fairly numerous but of no great extent, the largest so far observed being about one mile long by half a mile wide; this was in the Ramisi-Mafasini neighbourhood. further damage to bananas and coco-nuts is reported from Mafasini, Msambweni and Gazi, and at Ramisi an area of fifty acres of sugar cane has been badly eaten by flyers. It is reported that some 60 per cent of the younger coco-nut trees have been stripped in most of the districts named but that the larger trees have escaped comparatively lightly.

Nearly all of the native crops will have been harvested during the next fortnight, and as by that time the remaining infestation will consist of flyers only, except perhaps for some bands in the Malindi area, the hopper campaign at the coast can then be regarded as concluded.

About ten days ago a moderate flying swarm, coming from the direction of the Masai Reserve, was observed in the vicinity of Mazeras. swarm proceeded towards Mombasa and settled on the Maunguja Estate. A power spray unit was detailed to deal with this swarm, and the latest reports indicate that fair progress has been made with its destruction, though considerable damage has been done to the coco-nut palms on the estate.

Nyanza Province.—It can now be stated with some certainty that the present invasion of flying swarms into South Kavirondo has ceased, and that no extensive damage has been caused by the swarms previously reported.

TENDERS by way of Stand Premium are invited for the grants in respect of the three petrol plots at Nairobi as specified in the Schedule hereto.

Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office attached to the Survey and Registration Division, Nairobi, and at the office of the District Commissioner at Nairobi, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General, Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Petrol Plot" must be deposited with the undersigned before noon on Wednesday, the 15th August, 1934.
- 2. No tender of less than the reserve price as shown in the Schedule will be considered. The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
- 3. The successful tenderer will be required to pay to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, within seven days of notification of the acceptance of his tender a deposit of 25 per cent of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1934. In default of such payment, the acceptance of the tender may be cancelled and any moneys paid will be forfeited.
- 4. The balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Box 424, Nairobi.

The survey fees (Sh. 105 per plot), the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant, and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Box 89, Nairobi.

All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a demand being made therefor.

Upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

- 5. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 4, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid as therein laid down within seven days of a demand therefor, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited, and the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.
- 6. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descrip-

tions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

- 7. Grants will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term will be 99 years from the 1st day of September, 1934.
- 8. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.
- 9. The plot and the buildings to be erected thereon shall be used for the sole purpose of the retail sale of petrol and motor accessories, and shall not be used for residential purposes.
- 10. Each purchaser will be required to erect on his plot within six months of the date of the approval of his plans a building of approved design constructed of stone, brick or concrete.
- 11. The scheme of building and the general layout of the plot shall be approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council, and no buildings shall be erected on any plot unless and until plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall have been previously approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council and the Commissioner of Lands (or such other person as he shall appoint), and until the general lay-out shall have been approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council.

Plans, etc., shall in the first instance be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action, such submission to be within one month of the date of the commencement of the grant.

- 12. The building shall not be of more than one story in height.
- 13. Verandas shall not be erected outside the boundaries of the plot.
- 14. Where necessary an area surrounding the plot will be vested in the Municipal Council in order that the plot may be surrounded by suitable horticultural treatment.
- 15. The grantee will be required to pave with bitumen-bound macadam, such portions of the unplanted and unbuilt upon area within the boundaries of the plot as stipulated by the Municipal Council and maintain the same to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands. The Nairobi Municipal Council will undertake this macadam construction and maintenance on behalf of the purchaser who will be responsible for the cost, which shall be payable to the Municipal Council within seven days of demand.
- 16. The Nairobi Municipal Council will construct and maintain the road areas from the boundaries of the alienated plot to the main road in the vicinity of the plot to a bitumen-bound macadam standard.
- 17. Under the provisions of section 60 (b) of the Crown Lands Ordinance, the grantee will be required to pay the Municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plot. A clause will, therefore, be embodied in the grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and Government.

HIS MAJESTY'S COURT OF APPEAL FOR EASTERN AFRICA.


