The Red Locust.—Reports received from the coast during the week merely confirm that the numerous scattered groups of flyers continue to mass into larger aggregations and to move in a north-westerly direction.

Further extensive damage to coco-nut palms on private estates in the Gazi neighbourhood is reported, in one instance it is estimated that an area of a hundred acres has been completely stripped.

It would appear that the southern portion of Digo is now comparatively free of flyers, as the majority of the groups have migrated to the more north-westerly parts.

No reports of any large flying swarms have been received during the week from any area.
