LOCUST REPORT, 16th AUGUST, 1934.

The Red Locust.

Coast Province.—Numerous swarms of young flyers are causing considerable further damage to the coco palms and it is reported from Ramisi that heavy damage has been done on the cane fields by a fresh influx of flying swarms from the Reserves.

The hopper campaign is now being closed down in all districts.

Two minor swarms passed over Kisii and Kericho during the past week, and entered the Mau Forest.

A medium swarm was reported at Naivasha on the 10th instant. As the swarm approached Naivasha from Kijabe it is assumed that it is the same which was present in the outskirts of Nairobi some three weeks ago. No report of any damage has been received from Naivasha.

## GENERAL NOTICE No. 1110

#### NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that as from the 13th August, 1934, the provisions of the laws relating to Customs will be applied to all goods imported into or exported from the Uganda Protectorate across the Uganda-Belgian Congo frontier at Kisoro, and that His Excellency the Governor of Uganda has been pleased to appoint Kisoro as a Port of Entry for customs purposes with effect from the 13th August, 1934. Arrangements for the establishment of a customs office and the necessary staff have been made.

On and after the above date all goods imported into Uganda at Kisoro must be produced for customs entry and examination and the proper duties chargeable thereon must be paid before delivery can be allowed. Goods declared for export must be similarly produced and entered prior to transportation to the Belgian Congo or Ruanda.

Goods declared in transit from Mombasa to the Belgian Congo or Ruanda via Kisoro must be produced together with the relative Transit Entry which will require certification by the Customs Officer before Bond can be cancelled. Goods in transit from the Belgian Congo or Ruanda to Mombasa via Kisoro must be produced and entered.

Kisoro will be the Customs Port of Entry for traffic between Kenya and Uganda and the Belgian Congo and Ruanda via the Kabale-Rutchuru-Ruhengeri roads, and the District Commissioner, Kabale, no longer will function for purposes of customs. Landing Certificates for Bond cancellation or drawback purposes will not be required in respect of goods the exportation of which is certified by the Customs Officer at Kisoro.

All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a demand being made therefor.

Upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140, Revised Edition), and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.

7. - 4. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Municipal Council of Nairobi.

#### (c) Special.

- 1. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete, on proper foundations.
- 2. No building shall at any time during the term of the grant be used for any other purpose than a private dwelling-house, or an appurtenance thereto.
- 3. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with the necessary appurtenances, offices and out-buildings be erected on any plot without the consent of the Governor.
- 4. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.
- 5. The grantee shall not at any time divide the land.
- 6. All out-buildings, offices, etc., shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Municipal Council of Nairobi, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.
- 7. Under the provisions of section 60 (b) of the Crown Lands Ordinance, grantees will be required to pay municipal rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plot. A clause will therefore be embodied in the grant providing for the necessary adjustments between the grantee and Government.

# RABIES REPORT.

The rabies position is again giving cause for alarm on account of the isolated outbreaks of the disease whose sources of infection are unknown. The extensive baiting campaign is continued in districts and native locations in and around the infected areas, with the object of reducing the number of pariahs and jackals.

Two positive cases, both in jackal, have occurred, since our last progress report, dated the 14th July, was published: one in the Turbo area of the Uasin Gishu district and the other in the Kakamega area of the North Kavirondo Native Reserve, while a third case in this reserve, in a dog, which, on examination, was found to be highly suspicious, has been considered a positive one.

A general outline of the rabies position from the 1st January, 1934, to the 30th June, 1934, is as follows:—

Eight out of the ten cases returned as positive to rabies have been found affecting jackals; while the remaining two cases have been confirmed in dogs, with a history of having possibly come into contact with rabid jackals.

The outbreaks were reported from the following districts:—Uasin Gishu District 4; North Kavirondo Reserve 2; Central Kavirondo 2; Kisumu-Londiani District (Songhor) 2.

22,085 baits were laid which caused mortality among 2,230 dogs, 99 jackals and 36 other animals. Double the number of baits are being taken during this year's campaign as compared with last year's.

KIND OF THE WAR TO SEE

15 natives were bitten by rabid animals.

During the year it was found possible to revoke from quarantine the South Kavirondo Native Reserve and the South Lumbwa Administrative District, while on the other hand it was necessary to impose a quarantine on an area in the North Kavirondo Reserve.
