His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill relating to the Re-Transfer of Property to a Certain German Mission.

WHEREAS by Article 438 of the Treaty of Peace **Preamble** between the Allied and Associated Powers and Germany signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June one thousand nine hundred and nineteen it is provided and agreed that where Christian religious missions were being maintained by German Societies or persons in territory belonging to any one of the Allied and Associated Powers the property which such Missions or Missionary Societies possessed should continue to be devoted to Missionary purposes and that in order to ensure the due execution of this undertaking the Allied and Associated Governments would hand over such property to Boards of Trustees to be appointed by or approved by the Governments and composed of persons holding the faith of the Mission whose property is involved :

AND WHEREAS certain property in the Colony was being maintained by German Societies or persons for missionary purposes and the said property is by the German Missions Ordinance, 1924, vested in such trustees and upon such trusts as the Secretary of State may appoint and determine : **No. 5 of 1924.**

AND WHEREAS by a Deed made the thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six between the Secretary of State of the one part and the Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited of 30 John Street Bedford Row in the County of London of the other part the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said German Missions Ordinance, 1924, appointed the said Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited (hereinafter called "the Trustees") as a Trustee and directed that the Trustees should hold the property in the Colony of the Leipzig Evangelical Mission upon and for the trusts and purposes therein set forth :

AND WHEREAS the said German Missions Ordinance, 1924, was repealed by the German Missions (Repeal) Ordinance 1931 : **No. 8 of 1931.**

AND WHEREAS by an Agreement made on or about the 12th day of November, 1930, between the Trustees of the one part and the Leipzig Lutheran Mission of the other part, the Trustees consented, *inter alia*, to the said Deed dated the 30th day of September, 1926, being revoked :

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to empower the parties to the said Agreement to give effect to the said Agreement :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title
and
commencement

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the German Missions (Revesting) Ordinance, 1934, and shall come into operation upon such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint.

Revesting of
certain mission
property.

2. (1) All property now vested in the Trustees under and by virtue of the said Deed made the 30th day of September, 1926, shall by virtue of this Ordinance, be vested in the said Leipzig Lutheran Mission.

(2) The said Deed is hereby revoked.

Release of
trustees.

3. This Ordinance shall operate as a complete release and discharge of the Trustees in respect of any acts, omissions or liability on the part of them or their agents relating to the property mentioned in section 2 of this Ordinance.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The objects and reasons for this Bill are detailed in its preamble.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

LOCUST REPORT, 31st AUGUST, 1934.

DURING the last fortnight several small swarms of young flyers have been reported from various parts of the Colony. The swarm which was at Naivasha on the 16th instant, has moved east and north-east and the larger portion is now located in the vicinity of Chuka, about 50 miles south of Meru, but no damage is reported. Swarms of varying dimensions have visited the Kisii-Sotik-Kericho triangle, but no serious crop damage has taken place until the advent of a very large swarm in the Buret district was reported on the 29th instant. This huge

swarm extends to 20 miles in length and 8 miles in width and has already caused heavy damage, the maize crops in the neighbourhood of Buret having been wiped out. According to latest reports the swarm is stationary in the Kipsongoi-Letein-Ngoina area; its movements are being closely watched.

Other swarms of minor importance have been observed at Kikuyu and South Kitui.

If these amounts be not paid within the time stated, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the grantee to be forfeited, and the grantee shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

(b) General.

1. The grant will be for 25 years from the 1st October, 1934, and will be subject to the ordinary conditions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, as governing township plots and to the following conditions:—

2. The title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance.

3. 3. The purchaser of the plot shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant, a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete, asbestos, wood or iron on proper foundations.

6. A veranda may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the authority, and must conform to a building line decided upon by such authority.


