The definition of "contributor" which it is proposed to amend:—

"contributor" means a person who is not prohibited from being a contributor by the provisions of section 5 of this Ordinance, and who holds an office which has been declared by the Governor by notice to be a post in the Local European Civil Service of the Colony, or such other post in the Civil Service of the Colony or in a common service as the Governor may by notice direct. All such posts are hereinafter referred to as "the service";

Sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

- (1) every male contributor shall, as from the date of commencement of this Ordinance, or in the case of a contributor appointed after that date as from the date of his appointment, make contributions to the fund at the rate of five per centum per annum of his salary;
- (2) every female contributor shall, as from the date of commencement of this Ordinance, or in the case of a contributor appointed after that date as from the date of her appointment, make contributions to the fund at the rate of seven and one-half per centum per annum of her salary;

A Bill to Amend the European Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, 1934.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

This Ordinance may be cited as the European Civil Short title. Service Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the European Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the Principal No. 27 of 1934. Ordinance.

2. The definition of "contributor" which appears in Amendment of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the section 2 of addition, at the end thereof, of the following proviso:-

"Provided that the term 'contributor' shall not include any person whom the Governor may, by notice states the in the Gazette, exclude, either by name or by office, from the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7 (1) of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend: —

Rights of contributors against fund.

7. (1) A contributor who retires or resigns from or is removed on grounds other than misconduct from the service shall, on such retirement, resignation, or removal, as the case may be, be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which he has made to the fund together with interest thereon, and shall in addition be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 of this Ordinance on his behalf, together with interest thereon:

Section 7 (1) (e) of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

(e) in the case of a female contributor on attaining the age of fifty years,

Section 7 (3) of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

(3) A female contributor who marries while in the service shall on such marriage be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which she has made to the fund together with interest thereon, and shall in addition be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 of this Ordinance on her behalf together with interest thereon, provided that a female contributor who marries while in the service before she has completed four years' continuous service as a contributor shall on such marriage be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which she has made to the fund, together with interest thereon, and shall in addition be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 (a) of this Ordinance on her behalf together with interest thereon. A female contributor shall cease to be a contributor to the fund with effect from the end of the month immediately preceding her marriage.

(a) A female contributor who marries while in the service and who on the date of such marriage has completed four or more years' continuous service as a contributor shall, on submitting to the Treasurer, within three months of the date of her marriage, satisfactory proof of such marriage, be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which she has made to the fund, together with interest thereon, and shall, in addition, be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 of this Ordinance on her behalf, together with interest thereon.
 - (b) A female contributor who marries while in the service and who on the date of her marriage has completed less than four years' service as a contributor shall, on submitting to the Treasurer within three months of the date of her marriage satisfactory proof of such marriage, be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which she has made to the fund, together with interest thereon, and shall, in addition, be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 (a) of this Ordinance on her behalf, together with interest thereon.

Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

Gratuities to contributors.

10. In addition to any payment from the fund to which a contributor may have a claim under the foregoing provisions of this Ordinance it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant from the public revenues of the Colony to a contributor who retires after continuous satisfactory service of not less than fifteen years a gratuity not exceeding the amount of one week's salary, based on the salary drawn at the date of retirement, for each completed year of service.

- (c) A female contributor who resigns from the service for the purpose of getting married and who at the date of ceasing to be a contributor has completed less than four years' continuous service as a contributor shall be paid from the fund a sum equal to the aggregate of the contributions which she has made to the fund, together with interest thereon, and shall, in addition, on submitting to the Treasurer not later than six months after the date on which she ceased to be a contributor satisfactory proof of her marriage, be entitled to any contributions made to the fund from general revenue under section 6 (a) of this Ordinance on her behalf, together with interest thereon.
- (d) A female contributor who marries while in the service shall cease to be a contributor to the fund with effect from the end of the month immediately preceding her marriage."

Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of this Ordinance, the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, declare that any officer serving in an appointment which is subject to notice not exceeding one month on either side shall be deemed to be a contributor for the purposes of this Ordinance with effect from, and to be eligible to contribute to the fund from, a date to be specified in such notice:

Provided that the Governor shall only exercise the powers conferred upon him by this section in the case of an officer who would, but for the provisions of paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of this Ordinance, be a contributor within the meaning of this Ordinance."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The European Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, 1934, has not yet been brought into operation; but in dealing with a similar measure for the Asian Civil Service certain anomalies in the Ordinance have been disclosed, and this Bill is designed to remove those anomalies and to effect certain verbal amendments to the Principal Ordinance.

It is not anticipated that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Stamp Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

Cap. 57.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Ordinance (Chapter 57 of the Revised Edition) hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after paragraph (11) thereof of the following paragraph to be numbered (11A).

No. 24 of 1930.

"(11A). 'Gift' means a transfer of movable or immovable property made voluntarily and without valuable consideration, but does not include an instrument under the Chattels Transfer Ordinance, 1930, nor a transfer under Article 59 of the Schedule to this Ordinance. Any conveyance or transfer (not being a disposition made in favour of a purchaser or incumbrancer or other person in good faith and for valuable consideration) shall, for the purposes of this definition be deemed to be a gift, and (except where marriage is the consideration), the consideration for any conveyance or transfer shall not for this purpose be deemed to be valuable consideration when the Commissioners are of opinion that by reason of the inadequacy of the sum paid as consideration or other circumstances the conveyance or transfer confers a substantial benefit on the person to whom the property is conveyed or transferred: Provided that the term 'gift' shall not include a transfer of movable or immovable property made voluntarily and without valuable consideration to a charitable institution recognized by the Commissioners."

OBJECTS AND REASONS,

Gifts, without valuable consideration, or for a nominal consideration, bear ad valorem duty on the value of the property in England and in India, but the position is not clear under the Stamp Ordinance in Kenya. The intention of the Stamp Ordinance is that all instruments operating as gifts should bear ad valorem duty, but by a custom, which is becoming increasingly prevalent, ad valorem duty has been avoided by inserting a nominal money consideration in the instrument, thereby bringing the instrument within the definition of "conveyance" under the Ordinance, thus escaping with nominal stamp duty. By means of this custom Government has lost legitimate revenue.

By defining the term "gift", which is done in Clause 2 of the Bill, it will become impossible to bring an instrument of gift within the definition of "conveyance" under the Principal Ordinance, and, consequently, such instrument will have to pay ad valorem stamp duty.

The object of Clause 3 of the Bill is to vary the stamp duty payable on transfer of shares, so as to bring the duty more into line with the rates obtaining in other countries.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

LOCUST REPORT, 30th NOVEMBER, 1934.

Present Condition and Forecast.

KENYA.

THE RED LOCUST.

Definite improvement in the locust situation has occurred since the 14th of the month when the last report was issued. At that date reports from Tanganyika stated migration in that Territory to be definitely in northern and north-westerly directions. A report dated the 20th instant now states "the northerly direction of flight appears to have been arrested, and the general direction of flight appears to be south-west, except where green food is abundant on Kilimanjaro and Meru Mountains. where locusts are content to remain." Therefore for the present, danger of infestation from the south and laying of eggs by swarms from Tanganyika is reduced for the time being. This southerly direction of migration may be temporary, but as the general tendency of flight of the red locust at this time of year when temperatures increase in countries is to the south, this direction may be maintained. In these circumstances, and there being no indication of invasion from Uganda, the outlook has improved.

With regard to locusts in the Colony, the Administrative Department reports two swarms in the Sotik area which are attended by thousands of predatory birds. Other swarms exist in various parts, but many districts are reported clear. No reports of damage to crops have been received.

Indications at present are that the forthcoming campaign in 1935 may be restricted to comparatively small areas. Nevertheless all sections of the public are earnestly requested to forward the fullest information possible to the Department of Agriculture through District Commissioners and the Police.

Acknowledgements.

It is desired to acknowledge valued assistance given by the neighbouring territories in keeping this Colony informed as to the situation in their areas. Especial thanks are due to the Director of Agriculture, Tanganyika, and his staff for forwarding information by telegram in addition to periodical reports. Kenya is also indebted to Tanganyika for valuable assistance rendered in the field. On the emergence of hoppers in the Voi District of this Colony early in the year assistance in combating

them was offered by the Anti-Locust Service of Tanganyika and accepted with appreciation by this Department. This practical assistance enabled this infestation to be dealt with immediately and at a fraction of the cost which would have been incurred otherwise. In this and other instances the degree of co-operation achieved between the two territories is worthy of note.

Such open space shall be at the rear of the building, and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than 10 feet.

- 3. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete or wood and iron on proper foundations, and shall maintain the same.
