His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

A Bill relating to the Protection of the Coir Fibre Industry.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Coir Fibre Industry Short title. Ordinance, 1935.
- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise re-Interpretation. quires, "coir" means the fibre comprising the outer covering of the fruits of the coco-nut palm, Cocos nucifera.
- 3. (1) No person shall manufacture articles made from Licences. coir in a factory the machinery of which is operated by mechanical power unless he is in possession of a licence issued to him in that behalf by the Governor in Council.

- (2) Every applicant for a licence under this section shall specify the building and/or place at which he proposes to manufacture articles made from coir, and no licensee shall manufacture these articles otherwise than at such building or place.
 - (3) The Governor in Council may, in his discretion—
 - (a) refuse to issue a licence to any person on the ground that a sufficient number of licences has already been granted or on any other ground which may appear to him to be sufficient; or
 - (b) revoke a licence if he is satisfied that any of the conditions subject to which the licence is issued are not being complied with.
- (4) Every licence shall be for such term, in such form, and shall contain and be subject to such conditions, as may be prescribed by the Governor in Council.

Penalty.

4. Any person who contravenes the provisions of subsection (1) or sub-section (2) of section 3 of this Ordinance or who fails to comply with any of the conditions prescribed in a licence issued to him under sub-section (4) of section 3 of this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill, which closely follows the Sisal Bag Industry Ordinance, 1932, is to prohibit the manufacture of coir products in a factory unless such factory is licensed.

- 2. It is considered that the provisions of the Bill will enable a measure of protection to be given to persons who are prepared to devote their capital and enterprise to the production of coir products, and thus foster the development of the coco-nut industry in the Colony.
- 3. No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A Bill to Amend the Tribal Police Ordinance, 1929.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tribal Police Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Tribal Police Ordinance, 1929, hereinafter referred to as No. 10 of 1929. the Principal Ordinance.
- 2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the Amendment addition, next after section 8 thereof, of the following section of the Principal as section 8A:—

Ordinance.

"8A It shall be lawful for a tribal police officer to Carrying of carry arms in such circumstances and subject to such arms by tribal directions as may from time to time be issued by the person in whom the superintendence of the tribal police is vested under section 3 of this Ordinance."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

- 4. The successful tenderers will be required to demarcate roughly their respective areas. To each area only one road of access will be allowed, to be agreed to by the Forest Officer.
- 5. All regulations imposed by the Veterinary Department regarding the movement of stock must be strictly observed.
