#### GENERAL NOTICE No. 167

LOCUST REPORT, 31st JANUARY, 1935.

#### KENYA.

RED LOCUST.

The report dated the 16th instant stated that owing to the probability of invasion by swarms from Tanganyika Territory, the outlook was not as favourable as at the commencement of the year. Since that date large swarms flying northward have been reported in the Umba Valley on the Tanganyika-Kenya border at the coast and invasion must be anticipated. Dense swarms of mature locusts flying in a northerly direction are also reported between Moinbo and Tanga. These may cross the border into Kenya very shortly and lay.

The Masai, Voi and Digo Districts, where they may enter are very sparsely populated by natives and there are few or no Europeans. Hence all swarms present may not be seen by official observers and not be reported.

Emphasis is again placed on the necessity for all sections of the population to report the presence of adult locusts or hoppers to the nearest District Commissioner or European Police Officer. Especially is it the duty of all persons observing locusts in the Masai, Voi and Digo Districts to report the location, direction of flight and the approximate dimensions of swarms in flight or at rest, to the District Commissioner, Ngong, or the Agricultural Department, Nairobi. It will also be appreciated if observers can collect six or more locusts from each swarm and forward them to the Department.

There are still a few swarms elsewhere in the Colony, but these are small and for various reasons, including destruction by birds, are diminishing in size.

#### TANGANYIKA TERRITORY.

Swarms are reported in all Provinces and extensive laying has taken place. Locusts have entered from the south and proceeded northward, which is the general direction of flight.

Infestation on some scale is reported from the Western and Lake Provinces, as well as those bordering the sea. At Kilosa laying and hatching has occurred over thirty square miles. A report dated the 16th instant stated that weather conditions have not been favourable to locusts, and hatchings so far discovered are generally said to be sparse, but layings are extensive and attack by birds has come too late to be of great value.

- 3. The grantee of the plot shall pay to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani, within seven days of the acceptance of his tender, 25 per cent of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1935. In default of such payment the sale of the plot may be cancelled.

4. The balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani.

The survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant, and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi.

All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a request for payment being made when the grant is ready for execution. If these amounts be not paid within the time stated, the Commissioner for Local Government, Lands and Settlement may order the deposit made by the grantee to be for-feited, and the grantee shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

- (b) General.

  1. The grant will be for 25 years from the 1st April, 1935, and will be subject to the ordinary conditions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, as governing township plots and to the following conditions:-
- 2. The title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance.
- 3. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose, shall have the right to enter upon any plot, and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.
- 4. No building shall be erected on the plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved

by the authority, in accordance with the Trading Centres Rules that have been applied to Kibos Trading Centre, and by the Commissioner of Lands or such person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kisumu-Londiani, for necessary

- 5. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.
- 6. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the authority.

(c) Special.

1. The plot may be used for business purposes only, or for the combined purposes of business and residence.

Provided that in the event of the plot being used for the said combined purposes, then not more than one-half of the area thereof shall be built upon; otherwise not more than ninety per cent of the area thereof shall be built upon.

2. In no case shall the area of the plot, if used solely for business purposes, required to remain unbuilt on be less than 300 square feet, and the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto and in accordance with a design approved by the authority.

Such open space shall be at the rear of the building, and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet, whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than 10 feet.

- 3. The purchaser of the plot shall erect within one year of the commencement of his grant, a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, concrete, asbestos, wood or iron on proper founda-
- 4. If at any time during the term of the grant a main building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations, be erected on the plot, the grantee shall be entitled to an extension of the term of the grant to 99 years from the 1st April, 1935.
- 5. At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot or any portion thereof, or any building erected on the plot, be used for the purposes of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.
- 6. A veranda may be erected within a road reserve with the previous consent of the authority, and must conform to a building line decided upon by such authority.
