LOCUST REPORT, 15TH FEBRUARY, 1935.

THE RED LOCUST.

KENYA.

Coast Province.—Invasion anticipated from Tanganyika as stated in the report dated the 31st January had commenced by the 7th instant. At least one large swarm had entered the Umba Valley in the Digo District of the Coast Province by that date and is flying northward toward Mombasa. This had reached Muhaka by the 14th.

Central Province.—A swarm of considerable dimensions has emerged from the Masai District and proceeding north-east may menace crops in eastern parts of the Central Province.

Masai District.—A small stationary swarm is present between Ngong and Kajiado. Owing to the presence of birds it is improbable that this will reach cultivated areas and cause damage.

Locust destruction.—Full preparations have been made for dealing with hoppers immediately they appear, but no laying other than that on the small scale at the coast having been reported, it is improbable that the operations in the field will be necessary for some weeks. Hoppers hatching on the coast are being destroyed immediately they appear.

TANGANYIKA.

Large swarms have entered Handeni from the south causing considerable damage to maize, bananas and other crops. Swarms are reported to be concentrating and laying on the plains between the mountains and the Kenya border in the Lushoto District. Egg-laying and emergence of hoppers is reported in several other parts of the Territory, including the Babati area of Mbulu where infestation is fairly heavy. Destruction near habitation is proceeding and it is reported that the situation is not serious. Moshi and Arusha districts are reported to be clear.
