LOCUST REPORT, 27_{TH} FEBRUARY, 1935. THE RED LOCUST.

KENYA.

Coast Province.—The northerly direction of flight of swarms from Tanganyika Territory is being maintained. The District Commissioner, Kilifi, reported the arrival of a small swarm north of Mazeras on the 22nd instant and information received from the Digo District to the south is to the effect that locusts

in locations near the sea and a few miles inland are moving in north and north-easterly directions. Damage caused to crops up to present is said to be negligible. Some swarms are mature, and although scattered laying on a very small scale has been observed, general laying has not yet taken place.

Central Province and Masai District.—As nothing further has been heard of the swarm reported to be flying north-east from the south-eastern portion of the Central Province, the probability of destruction of crops in that area is reduced for the present.

Nyanza Province.—Locusts are reported in small numbers on the Tanganyika border in Utende. As the general direction of flight of swarms at present is northward, these may enter Kenya shortly. Specimens received indicate that these are approaching maturity.

TANGANVIKA

The main infestation appears to be in the Lake and Western Provinces, where the position will be clearer at the end of the month or early March. The situation in the Rift Valley is reported to be favourable. Twenty-two miles of zinc band has been distributed in the worst areas and supplies of equipment and poison in hand are ample for all emergencies anticipated in the Territory. Sparse laying has taken place over wide areas, and where observed, egg pockets are being dug up and destroyed. Natural agencies such as unfavourable weather, birds, old age and blow-fly larvae are taking their toll of swarms.

UGANDA

Tropical, migratory and red locusts are still present in Uganda, but as most of the swarms are in western areas they are not a menace to Kenya at present. As far as can be forecasted their direction of flight will not be easterly toward this Colony. The majority of the swarms of migratory locusts now flying in Uganda are stated to be small and diffuse and practically no damage is being done. Red locusts laid in Ankole in November and hatching commenced in mid-January. Hatchings are not large and are under control.
