### GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 251

His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

### A Bill to Regulate the Sale and Distribution of Pyrethrum Grown in the Colony.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

This Ordinance may be cited as the Sale of Pyrethrum Short title. Ordinance, 1935.

### 2. In this Ordinance—

Interpretation.

"agency" means the person or body of persons from time to time appointed by the Governor in Council to be an agency for the purposes of this Ordinance;

"purchase" includes agree or contract to purchase and connotes taking delivery of the article purchased and making payment therefor within a reasonable time;

"pyrethrum" means the dried flowers or dried ground flowers of the plant known botanically as Pyrethrum cinerarifolium or any product of such flowers;

"pyrethrum grower" means any person who grows pyrethrum for sale;

"sell" includes agree or contract to sell.

3. The Governor in Council may, by proclamation, Governor in appoint any person or body of persons to be an agency for the purposes of this Ordinance, and may in like manner revoke or agency. vary such appointment. As and from the date of any such appointment and so long as there is an agency so appointed the provisions of sections 4 to 10 inclusive of this Ordinance shall apply.

4. (1) Every person carrying on the business of a Registration pyrethrum grower shall within one month after the commencement of this Ordinance, or within one month after he begins to carry on the said business, register himself as a pyrethrum grower at the office of the District Commissioner of the district or one of the districts in which he carries on business.

of pyrethrum

(2) A fee of five shillings shall be payable for such registration.

Pyrethrum to be sold to agency.

5. No pyrethrum grower shall sell any pyrethrum to any person other than an agency.

Agency only to purchase pyrethrum. 6. No person other than an agency shall purchase any pyrethrum from any pyrethrum grower.

Agency to purchase all pyrethrum offered.

7. An agency shall purchase all pyrethrum offered to it by any grower which is suitable for the purpose of preparation of an insecticide of good quality.

Penalty for offences.

8. Any person who is guilty of a breach of the provisions of any of the foregoing sections of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder shall on conviction before a magistrate of the first or second class be liable for a first offence to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment, and for a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds or to imprisonment for twelve months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

Agency to supply East African demands. 9. An agency may sell pyrethrum in any market, whether within or without the Colony, but it shall be the first duty of an agency to supply the demands of the Colony and of other East African territories to the satisfaction of the Governor.

Appeal from agency to Governor.

10. Any person aggrieved by any decision of an agency, either as to the price to be paid for pyrethrum by such agency or as to the price to be charged for that pyrethrum by such agency or as to the failure or refusal of an agency to purchase pyrethrum from or to supply the legitimate demands of such person for pyrethrum may appeal to the Governor, whose decision shall be final, but nothing in this section contained shall be deemed to deprive any person of any right of action which he may have in any competent court of the Colony.

Power to make rules.

- 11. The Governor in Council may make rules—
- (a) prescribing the conditions on which an agency may be appointed;
- (b) prescribing the duties and functions of an agency;
- (c) controlling the manufacture and sale of products of pyrethrum flowers grown in the Colony; and
- (d) generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance.

### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is introduced at the desire of the Kenya Pyrethrum Growers' Association. Its objects are to ensure high quality of exports and generally to control the marketing of pyrethrum. The agency will be empowered to grade the product and to use uniform packing, both being necessary for the principal oversea markets. An Advisory Board will be appointed to assist the work of the agency and will be composed of members selected by the Pyrethrum Growers' Association and such other persons as may be considered necessary.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

COMMERCIAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GOVERNMENT OF LATVIA.

### NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given that a copy of a Parliamentary Paper, Treaty Series No. 35 (1934), has been received containing the text of a Commercial Agreement between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Government of Latvia, with Protocol and Notes, which was signed at London on the 17th of July, 1934. Ratifications were exchanged at London on the 2nd of October, 1934.

A copy of the full agreement may be seen on application to the Secretariat, but attention is directed to the following extracts therefrom:—

### ARTICLE 1.

The articles enumerated in Part II of the First Schedule to this Agreement, produced or manufactured in any British Colony, any territory under British protection or any mandated territory in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom, shall not on importation into Latvia from whatever place arriving be subjected to duties or charges other or higher than those specified in the Schedule, provided that such colony or territory enjoys most-favoured-nation treatment in Latvia in accordance with Article 26 or Article 27 of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation signed on the 22nd June, 1923.

LOCUST REPORT, 28TH MARCH, 1935.
THE RED LOCUST.

KENYA,

The situation in the Colony remains favourable. As far as can be ascertained, locusts have not entered Kenya from Tanganyika for several weeks, and other than a large swarm located between Meru and Kilimanjaro in that Territory, which might penetrate into the Masai District, invasion is not feared. Swarms still exist north of the Railway in the Coast Province, but damage to crops has not been reported. The Garissa and Lamu Districts on the coast are reported clear.

Laying and hatching of hoppers is limited to small patches in the Umba Valley and near Kwale in the Digo District of the Coast Province. These hoppers are being destroyed by the local population.

### TANGANYIKA.

The campaign in this Territory is proceeding and heavy mortality of hoppers is reported. Energetic steps have been taken to reduce the infestation, but owing to circumstances, including the difficulty of having the whole Territory under complete surveillance, it may not be possible to effect complete destruction and some escapes may occur. Damage to crops is reported in several provinces and more may occur, but infestation along the Kenya-Tanganyika border is not heavy and Kenya may not be menaced.

- 4. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot, or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor.
- 5. Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Authority.

### (c) Special.

Special Conditions in respect of Residential Plots.

- 1. Each purchaser of a plot shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete, on proper foundations.
- 2. No building shall at any time during the term of the grant be used for any other purpose than a dwelling-house.
- 3. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one dwelling-house with the necessary offices and out-buildings be erected on any plot without the consent of the Governor.

4. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.

5. All out-buildings, offices, etc., shall be properlysited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Authority or such other person as may be appointed, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant.
