### A Bill to Amend the Promissory Oaths Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :-

This Ordinance may be cited as the Promissory Oaths Short title. 1. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Promissory Oaths Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Revised Cap. 32. Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the Amendment of addition of the following Schedule :-

### ELDORET MUNICIPALITY.

ELDORET EUROPEAN HOSPITAL RATE, 1935.

NOTICE is hereby given that in accordance with the resolution passed by the Municipal Board of Eldoret at a Special Meeting called for that purpose on Thursday the 18th April, 1935, a Hospital Rate of Sh. 20 (twenty shillings) for the year ending 31st December, 1935, becomes payable at this office on Saturday, 1st June, 1935.

Every male person of wholly European origin or descent residing within the Municipality of Eldoret is liable for payment of this rate, excepting---

- (a) every person under the age of twenty-one years;
- (b) a person on a temporary visit to the Municipality not exceeding six months in duration.

The burden of proof of exemption from payment of the rate shall lie on the party claiming exemption.

THE RED LOCUST.

KENYA.

The situation in the Colony remains favourable, As far as can be ascertained swarms have not entered Kenya from Tanganyika for some considerable time, nor is invasion anticipated from now onward this year. Further laying of eggs and hatching of hoppers has not occurred in the Coast Province and damage to crops should be negligible. All other Provinces are clear.

#### TANGANYIKA.

The situation in this Territory is summarized as follows:

The situation at the moment is not considered serious, but the widespread nature of the layings reported from inhabited areas indicates that the Territory will not be free of flying swarms for some months. Damage so far has been inconsiderable, and with the indicated continuance of the rains, it is anticipated that cultivated crops will not be damaged generally and foodstuffs should be plentiful.

7. Provided that if the grantee shall receive no intimation from the Commissioner within one month of the date on which the plans have been approved by the Nairobi Municipal Council, he may proceed with the erection of the building in accordance with the plans submitted, and the Commissioner shall not have the power to cause to be made any alteration or variation in the plan or the date.

12. Subject to the proviso contained in clause 11 hereof, no building shall be erected on the plot unless plans (including a block plan showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, for necessary action.

13. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign any such subdivision without the consent in writing of the Governor.
