A Bill to Provide for the Legalization of the Payment of Certain Pensions to Certain Civil Servants Serving under the Terms Applicable to Asian Civil Servants who were Allowed to Retire Voluntarily.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Asian Civil Short title. Servants (Proportionate Pensions) Ordinance, 1935.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Non-Certain European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932, or in the persons per-Regulations made thereunder, or in any other law under which pensions may be granted to Asian civil servants in the service upon proof the Colony, each of the persons mentioned in the first persions. column of the Schedule hereto shall, with effect from the date No. 53 of 1932. set out opposite his name in the second column of the said Schedule be deemed to have been permitted to retire upon pension as from that date, and shall be deemed to have been legally granted from that date to the date of the commencement of this Ordinance and shall hereafter be granted from the date of the commencement of this Ordinance a pension proportionate to the length of his service computed in accordance with the provisions of the enactment set opposite his name in the third column of the said Schedule, and in every case subject to the limit prescribed in section 10 of the Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

In order to ease retrenchment measures all the officers whose names appear in the Schedule to this Bill were allowed to retire voluntarily, and have since their retirement been in the enjoyment of pensions, which pensions have been approved from time to time by the Governor in Council. The payment of these pensions must, however, be legalized by the legislature, and this Bill is introduced for the purpose of such legalization.

The pensions and gratuities granted under the scheme have amounted to approximately £9,220 in respect of gratuities and £4,428 per annum in respect of pensions.
