Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

Applications  
for advances

7. (1) All applications for advances shall be in a form prescribed by the Central Board and shall be addressed to the chairman of the appropriate local board, and the particulars in every application shall be verified by statutory declaration.

Method of

(2) The local board shall forward every such application, together with its comments thereon, to the Central Board, which shall consider each application on its merits, and shall fix the amounts (if any) to be allowed, the conditions on, and the time at which such advances shall be made, and the purposes to which such advances shall be applied, which purposes may, at the discretion of the Central Board, include the necessary personal expenses of a farmer.

His Excellency the Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

### A Bill to Amend the Agricultural Advances Ordinance, 1930.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Agricultural Advances (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Agricultural Advances Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (3) of section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following proviso:—

“Provided that, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1935, all advances shall bear interest at the rate of six and one-half per centum per annum.”

Short title.

No. 12 of 1930.

Amendment of section 7 (3) of the Principal Ordinance.

### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The Agricultural Advances Ordinance, 1930, was framed to meet economic circumstances which appeared at the time to be capable of relief by the institution of short-term loans. Since then events have proved that the period of liquidation will be considerably longer than was originally anticipated and with the concurrence of the Secretary of State the rate of interest on loans issued under the Ordinance is being reduced by this Bill from 8 per cent to 6½ per cent with effect from 1st January, 1935, the latter figure being equivalent to the rate charged by the Land Bank.

2. No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

## SPECIAL CHEAP RATES FOR MOTOR CARS.

DURING the months of July and August, passengers' privately owned and properly licensed motor cars will be conveyed between any two depot stations at the special cheap rate of Cents 20 per mile, for return journeys only, irrespective of weight or make of the car.

This special rate is subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) That one first class or two second class return tickets are held by the owner of the car at the time of booking.
- (b) That the rate is applied between depot stations only. For journeys between intermediate stations the rate will be levied on the return mileage between the depot station in the rear of the forwarding station to the depot station in advance of the destination station. From a depot station to an intermediate station the rate will be levied on the return mileage between that depot and the

depot station in advance of the destination station, while from an intermediate station to a depot station the rate will be levied on the return mileage between the depot in the rear of the forwarding station and the destination.

- (c) That the full return charges at Cents 20 per mile are paid at the original forwarding station.
- (d) That motor cars are conveyed at owner's risk only in sheeted open wagons.
- (e) That the rate applies only to used and licensed motor cars.

## GENERAL NOTICE No. 842

## RABIES PROGRESS REPORT.

Since the publication of the last Rabies Progress Report on the 3rd May, 1935, only one suspicious case has been reported from the Kakamega District.

During the year, four positive cases of rabies have been confirmed throughout the Colony—three from the Kakamega District and one from the Eldoret District, although other reports of escaped rabid jackals having bitten natives have been received from the North Kavirondo Native Reserve.

In consequence of the present favourable position, further areas have been relieved of quarantine restrictions on the movement of dogs.

Although the destruction of rabies carriers proceeds, the only districts in which any intensive poisoning exists are the Kakamega District and the North Kavirondo Native Reserve.

During the month of May, 3,000 poison baits were laid in the Kakamega Township and outskirts, causing a mortality of 46 dogs, 14 jackals and 67 others, while in the native locations—Kakalelwa, Watsotso, Kabras and West Kakamega—about 4,500 baits caused destruction of 137 dogs, 63 jackals, and 48 others.

The position of rabies infection is considered to be satisfactory at the moment.
