## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 495

His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following Bill being introduced into the Legislative Council.

### **A Bill to Provide for the Suppression of Noxious Weeds.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Suppression of Noxious Weeds Ordinance, 1935, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation.

“clear” in relation to plants, means dig up or pull up and burn, or employ other means of destruction authorized by the Director;

“Director” means the Director of Agriculture;

“inspector” means any person authorized in writing by the Director to perform the duties of an inspector under this Ordinance in an area to be specified by the Director;

“local authority” means—

(a) in the case of any municipality established under the jurisdiction of a municipal council or a municipal board, the municipal council or the municipal board, as the case may be, of such municipality as constituted under the provisions of the Local Government (Municipalities) Ordinance, 1928;

(b) in the case of any other area, the district commissioner, or such person, body of persons, or authority as the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, appoint to be the local authority for the purposes of this Ordinance;

“person responsible”, in relation to land, means—

(a) the occupier of land, or in the case of unoccupied land the registered owner thereof;

- (b) in the case of a mining location, the holder of such location;
- (c) in the case of Crown lands over which grazing or other rights have been granted, the holder of such rights;
- (d) in the case of land under the control of, or vested in, a local authority, the local authority concerned.

3. The Governor in Council may, from time to time by notice in the Gazette—

- (a) declare any plant to be a noxious weed in any area which shall be specified in such notice and which may consist either of the whole Colony or of one or more districts or portions thereof; or
- (b) vary or revoke such notice.

Duty of  
persons to  
report.

4. (1) It shall be the duty of every person responsible for any area of land in respect of which any plant has been declared to be a noxious weed under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance—

- (a) to report forthwith to an inspector, to a district commissioner or to the Director the presence of such noxious weed; and
- (b) to clear or cause to be cleared the said noxious weed occurring on the said area of land.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Power of

5. (1) An inspector may at all reasonable times enter upon any land situate in an area in respect of which he is authorized to be an inspector for the purpose of ascertaining whether any noxious or other weed exists thereon.

(2) Any person who obstructs or attempts to obstruct or hinder an inspector in the exercise of his duties under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

6. (1) If an inspector finds upon any land any plant which has been declared to be a noxious weed under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance he may, by notice in writing to the person responsible, require such person to clear the land of such noxious weed within a time to be specified in such notice.

(2) Such notice shall state the particular noxious weed which has been found upon the land, and as far as practicable, the portion or portions of the land on which such noxious weed has been found.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of such notice within the time specified in such notice shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

7. (1) If the person responsible fails to clear the land within the time specified in a notice under section 6 of this Ordinance an inspector may, upon receiving a written authority from the Director, enter with or without assistance upon the land and eradicate or cause to be eradicated any noxious weed found thereon.

(2) Any expenses incurred in such eradication shall be deemed to be a civil debt recoverable summarily from the person responsible at the suit of the Director :

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall relieve the person responsible of any penalty incurred under this Ordinance in consequence of his failure to comply with the provisions of a notice under section 6 of this Ordinance.

8. Any notice under this Ordinance shall be in writing and may be served—

Manner in which notice may be served.

- (i) personally upon the person responsible; or
- (ii) by leaving it addressed to the person responsible at his usual or last known place of abode; or
- (iii) by registered post.

9. Any person who is guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment, and in case of a continuing offence to a fine not exceeding two pounds for each day during which the offence continues.

Penalties.

10. Save as hereinafter provided, this Ordinance shall not apply to unalienated land situated within a native reserve :

Where noxious weed is in a native reserve.

Provided that where all or any part of an area in which the Governor in Council has declared any plant to be a noxious weed is on unalienated land in a native reserve, each headman who, under the provisions of the Native Authority Ordinance read together with the Compulsory Labour (Regulation) Ordinance, 1932, has power within such area or part thereof

to issue orders to be obeyed by the natives residing within the local limits of his jurisdiction, shall report forthwith to an inspector, or to a district commissioner the presence of such noxious weed, and shall, at the same time, in the exercise of such power as aforesaid, cause to be cleared the said noxious weed occurring on the said area of land.

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill provides for the eradication of noxious weeds within the Colony.

Clause 3 gives the Governor in Council power to declare any plant to be a noxious weed in any specified area.

Clause 4 imposes certain obligations upon the person responsible for an area of land in respect of which any plant has been declared to be a noxious weed.

Clause 5 provides for the inspection of land for noxious or other weeds.

Clause 7 provides that, in the event of the person responsible not eradicating a noxious weed an inspector may cause the same to be eradicated at the expense of the person responsible.

Clause 10 enables the measure to be enforced through the native authorities in the native reserves.

No immediate expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

**A Bill to Further and Protect the Activities and Interests of the Girl Guides Association in the Colony.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Girl Guides Short title. Ordinance, 1935.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Interpretation. requires—

“Association” means the Girl Guides Association incorporated under the Royal Charter granted on the fourteen day of December, 1922;

“Commissioner” means the person holding or acting in the office of Chief Commissioner for Girl Guides for Kenya;

“Girl Guide” means a Warranted Officer, Ranger, Girl Guide or Brownie recognized as such under the Rules of the Association and includes all officers of the Association;

“Rules of the Association” means the Rules relating to the Association contained in the book entitled “Rules, Policy and Organization”, as from time to time amended, and subject to any variations sanctioned in due form in accordance with the said Rules to meet local conditions in the Colony.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person, not being under the Rules of the Association duly authorized and entitled so to do, publicly to wear, carry or bear any uniform, badge, token or emblem which under the said Rules are specifically adopted for the use under the authority of the Association or which could reasonably be held to be an imitation of the same in such style or manner as to convey an impression that such person is under the said Rules entitled so to wear, carry or bear such uniform, badge, token or emblem.

4. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, any article bearing a badge, token or emblem specifically adopted for use under the authority of the Association, or which could reasonably be held to be an imitation of the same, unless he shall have first obtained authority from the Commissioner in writing to do so.

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to form, organize or work in connection with, or be concerned in forming, organizing, or working in connection with, any corps or body of persons who without due authority granted in accordance with the Rules of the Association claim or purport to be Girl Guides or otherwise to be connected with the Association or who hold themselves out, or pass themselves off, as Girl Guides or as otherwise connected with the Association:

Provided that no person shall be liable to conviction under this section who, being engaged at the date of the commencement of this Ordinance in work in connection with a corps or body of persons claiming or purporting to be Girl Guides, shall apply within three months of such date to the Commissioner for authority under the Rules of the Association to continue in such work, unless and until the Commissioner shall have refused to issue such authority and shall have informed the applicant accordingly.

Penalties.

6. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable on conviction for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding one month or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of the Bill is to protect the Girl Guides Association (which is incorporated by Royal Charter) by prohibiting the formation of Girl Guides organizations otherwise than under the authority of the Girl Guides Association and by prohibiting the wearing by unauthorized persons of the uniform, badges, etc., prescribed for Girl Guides and by controlling the sale of badges, etc.

The proviso to clause 5 makes it possible for existing Girl Guides organizations which were not formed and do not function under the authority of the Girl Guides Association to avoid the penalties prescribed by the Bill.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

**A Bill to Further and Protect the Activities and Interests of the Boy Scouts Association in the Colony.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Boy Scouts Short title. Ordinance, 1935.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Interpretation. requires—

“Association” means the Boy Scouts Association incorporated under the Royal Charter granted on the fourth day of January, 1912;

“Boy Scout” means a Warranted Officer, Rover Scout, Boy Scout or Wolf Cub recognized as such under the Rules of the Association and includes also all officers of the Association;

“Commissioner” means the person holding or acting in the office of Chief Commissioner of Boy Scouts for Kenya;

“Rules of the Association” means the Rules relating to the Association contained in the book entitled “Policy, Organization and Rules”, as from time to time amended, and subject to any variations sanctioned in due form in accordance with the said Rules to meet local conditions in the Colony.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person, not being under the Rules of the Association duly authorized and entitled so to do, publicly to wear, carry or bear any uniform, badge, token or emblem which under the said Rules are specifically adopted for use under the authority of the Association or which could reasonably be held to be an imitation of the same

in such style or manner as to convey an impression that such person is under the said Rules entitled so to wear, carry or bear such uniform, badge, token or emblem.

4. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, any article bearing a badge, token or emblem specifically adopted for use under the authority of the Association, or which could reasonably be held to be an imitation of the same, unless he shall have first obtained authority from the Commissioner in writing to do so.

5. (1) It shall not be lawful for any Boy Scout, not being otherwise thereunto lawfully entitled and authorized, to pretend to be, or to pass himself off as, or to arrogate to himself the authority, position or powers of, or to claim to be or to act as—

- (a) a member of the Kenya Police Force; or
- (b) a tribal police officer; or
- (c) an agent or officer of the Government or of any native authority or tribunal.

(2) No Boy Scout shall seek or attempt, by virtue of his wearing any uniform, badge, token or emblem of the Association or any uniform, badge, token or emblem purporting or appearing to be such, to enforce or exercise authority otherwise than in accordance with and as authorized by the Rules of the Association.

It shall not be lawful for any person to form, organize, or work in connection with, or be concerned in forming, organizing, or working in connection with, any corps or body of persons who without due authority granted in accordance with the Rules of the Association claim or purport to be Boy Scouts or otherwise to be connected with the Association or who hold themselves out, or pass themselves off, as Boy Scouts or as otherwise connected with the Association :

Provided that no person shall be liable to conviction under this section who, being engaged at the date of the commencement of this Ordinance in work in connection with the corps or body of persons claiming or purporting to be Boy Scouts, shall apply within three months of such date to the Commissioner for authority under the Rules of the Association to continue in such work, unless and until the Commissioner shall have refused to issue such authority and shall have informed the applicant accordingly.

7. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable on conviction for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding one month or to both such fine and such imprisonment. Penalties.

## PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the area defined in the Schedule hereto to be free from East Coast fever, and I hereby further declare that the said area shall be known as a "clean area" for the purposes of the Rules under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Proclamation No. 92 dated the 8th day of November, 1933, is hereby revoked.

## SCHEDULE.

## NORTHERN "CLEAN AREA."

The area bounded as follows:—

Commencing at the intersection of the Anglo-Italian boundary with the Lak Dera;

thence westerly by the Lak Dera to the Lorian Swamp and onwards following the river E. Uaso Nyiro up-stream to the point where the Meru-Archer's Post Road crosses that river;

thence southerly by that road for a distance of approximately 7 miles to a post;

thence still southerly by a line of posts to a post on the Nyeri-Meru old road;

thence westerly by that road to the Eastern Marania River;

thence south-westerly by the Meru District boundary (as defined by Proclamation No. 54 of the 25th February, 1924) to the summit of Mount Kenya;

thence south-westerly by a straight line to the most easterly corner of Farm L.R. No. 7147;

thence westerly and southerly by the eastern boundaries of that farm to its most south-eastern corner;

thence southerly by a straight line to the most northern corner of L.R. No. 3447/R;

thence generally easterly by the north-eastern boundary of L.R. No. 3447/R;

thence south-westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of L.R. No. 3447/R;

thence by the southern boundaries of L.R. Nos. 4402 and 5115 to the most south-western corner of L.R. No. 5115;

thence due west by a straight line to the Meri River;

thence south-westerly by the Meri River down-stream to its junction with the Thego River;

thence southerly by the Thego River down-stream to the south-eastern corner of Farm L.R. No. 3452;

thence westerly by the southern boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3452 to the Nairobi River;

thence generally northerly by the Nairobi River up-stream to its junction with the south-western corner of Farm L.R. No. 6376/2;

thence westerly by part of the southern boundaries of Farms L.R. Nos. 6376/2 and 6376/R to their intersection with the western boundary of the Nyeri-Naro Moru Road Reserve;

thence generally south-westerly by the western boundary of the main Nyeri-Naro Moru Road Reserve to the Amboni River;

thence following that river up-stream to its intersection with the north-eastern boundary of the Laikipia Forest Reserve;

thence south-easterly in a straight line to a point where that boundary meets the ridge of the Aberdare range running between Sattima and Kinangop;

thence following that ridge in a southerly direction to Kinangop;

thence in a straight line in a southerly direction to a point on the Chania River six miles below the western corner of Farm L.R. No. 5287;

thence up-stream by that river to a point one mile below Farm L.R. No. 5287;

thence in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the most eastern corner of Farm L.R. No. 1310;

thence following the general western boundary of the Kikuyu Escarpment Forest Reserve to the northern 100-foot zone of the Kenya and Uganda Railway;

thence by a straight line due south across the Kenya and Uganda Railway to the southern boundary of the southern 100-foot zone;

thence westerly by that zone to its intersection with the western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 2976/7;

thence south-westerly by part of that boundary to the most southerly corner of Farm L.R. No. 1708;

thence westerly by the southern boundary of that portion to its south-western corner;

thence westerly by straight lines to the trigonometrical beacon Ol Longonot and onwards to the most easterly corner of Farm L.R. No. 2662 on the boundary of the Masai Province;

thence in a generally westerly and northerly direction by that boundary to the most northerly corner of Farm L.R. No. 1316;

thence north-easterly by a straight line to the north-western corner of Farm L.R. No. 4336;

thence easterly and northerly by the generally eastern boundary of the Nakuru Lake Forest Reserve to the low-water mark of Lake Nakuru;

thence northerly, easterly and southerly by that low-water mark to its intersection with the northern boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3983, extended thereto;

thence north-easterly by the northern boundaries of that portion and of Farm L.R. No. 3982 to the north-eastern corner of the latter portion and onwards by the latter boundary extended across the Kenya and Uganda Railway to its eastern 100-foot zone;

thence southerly by that zone to the north-eastern corner of Farm L.R. No. 434;

thence easterly by the northern boundary of that portion to its north-eastern corner;

thence northerly and south-easterly by the western and northern boundaries of Farm L.R. No. 4477 to the Mororoni River;

thence by that river down-stream to the north-western corner of Farm L.R. No. 440/2;

thence easterly by the northern boundary of that portion to its north-eastern corner;

thence northerly by part of the western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3984 and the western boundaries of Farms L.R. Nos. 4682 and 465/2 to the north-western corner of the last portion.

thence north-easterly and northerly by the southern and easterly boundaries of the Nakuru Forest Reserve to the most northerly corner of Farm L.R. No. 1282/1;

thence south-westerly by a straight line to the most northerly corner of Farm L.R. No. 4725;

thence in a generally south-westerly direction by the northern and part of the western boundaries of Farm L.R. No. 4724 and the north-western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3662 to the western corner of the latter portion;

thence by part of the north-western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 442/3 to its intersection with the south-western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 4560, extended across the road reserve;

thence north-westerly by that extended line and the south-western boundary of Farm L.R. No. 4560 to the most western corner of that portion;

thence northerly and north-easterly by the western and part of the north-western boundaries of that portion to the most easterly corner of Farm L.R. No. 4559;

thence northerly and westerly by the eastern and northern boundaries of that portion to the south-western corner of Farm L.R. No. 3660;

thence northerly by the western boundaries of that portion and of Farms L.R. Nos. 2847, 2848, 2849, 2850, 5630, and 2676/R to the north-western corner of the last portion;

thence westerly by part of the southern boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3232 to the south-western corner of that portion;

thence northerly by the western boundaries of Farms L.R. Nos. 3232, 2678, 5233 and 2679 to the north-western corner of the last portion;

thence westerly by the southern boundary of Farm L.R. No. 3630 to the south-western corner of that portion;

thence in a generally northerly direction by the eastern boundaries of the Kamasia and Njemps Native Reserves as defined in Government Notice No. 394 of the 11th October, 1926, to the height shown on Topographical Sheet No. North A.137/S as 4141;

thence in a generally westerly direction by the generally southern boundary of the Suk Native Reserve; as defined in Government Notice No. 171 of the 18th May, 1920, to the Kerio or Ndo River;

thence northerly by that river down-stream to its junction with the Katune River;

thence generally south-westerly by the southern boundary of the West Suk District to the most northerly corner of Farm L.R. No. 5783;

thence north-westerly by the southern boundary of the Suk Native Reserve, as defined in the said Government Notice No. 394, to its south-western corner on the Kenya-Uganda boundary;

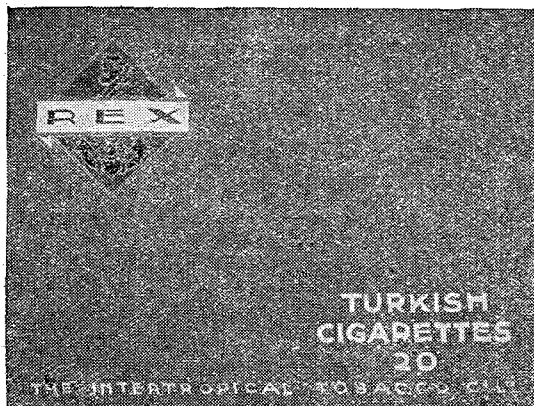
