A Bill to Make Special Provision in Regard to the Pension of Edward Gilbert Morris, O.B.E.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Morris Pension Ordinance, 1935. Short title.

2. Notwithstanding the proviso to Regulation 10 of the European Officers' Pensions (Consolidation) Regulations, 1930, the service of Edward Gilbert Morris from the 7th day of November, 1934, to the 30th day of March, 1935, both days inclusive, shall be deemed to be pensionable service for the purposes of the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, as if during that period he were the substantive holder of the office of Director of Education, and shall count for pension and gratuity under the said Ordinance.

Pensionability of service of E. G. Morris from the 7th November, 1934, to 30th March, 1935. No. 11 of 1927.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Mr. Morris, the Director of Education, was appointed to Kenya Colony with effect from the 7th November, 1934, although Mr. Scott, who was on leave, was the actual holder of the office until his leave expired on the 30th March, 1935.

It is thus necessary to make special legislative provision regarding Mr. Morris' pensionable service during that period, and this Bill is designed to achieve this object.

The amount of public money involved if the provisions of this Bill become law will amount to approximately £10 per annum, but this expenditure will not of course be incurred until Mr. Morris' ultimate retirement from the Colonial Service.

THE ELECTRIC POWER ORDINANCE
(Chapter 165 of the Revised Edition).

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Electric Power Ordinance (Chapter 165 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

Short title.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Electric Power (Electricity Meters) Rules, 1935.

Definitions.

2. For the purposes of these Rules the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless a different intention appears from the subject or context:—

“B.S.S.” or “British Standard Specification” means a standard specification issued by the British Standards Institution;

“meter” means and includes any and every kind of machine, device or instrument used for the measurement of the supply of electrical energy, and includes also such auxiliary appliances as resistors, shunts, reactances, current transformers, voltage transformers, and time switches, external to the meter, and the requirements of these Rules shall apply when all such auxiliary appliances are operating in connexion with the meter of which they form part.

Appropriate meter.

3. A meter shall be considered to be an appropriate meter for the purposes of section 88 of the Electric Power Ordinance (Cap. 165 of the Revised Edition) or an approved meter for the purposes of section 100 of the said Ordinance if it be of a

rating and type which is considered by an electrical inspector to be suitable for the circuit and load conditions to which it is or is to be subjected in service, and—

(a) if it be a meter which complies with B.S.S. Nos. 37 and 81, as current at the date of purchase of the meter, in so far as those specifications are applicable to the class of meter under consideration, with the deletion of clauses 35 and 37 of B.S.S. No. 37, 1930, and clauses 19 and 24 of B.S.S. No. 81, 1927, or the corresponding clauses in any previous or subsequent issues of those specifications which apply to the meter under consideration; or

(b) in the case of a meter of a type not covered by a British Standard Specification, if it be a meter of such construction and pattern as may be approved by the Governor.

4. The registering mechanism of any meter, except an electrolytic meter or a sub-standard meter with special dials for testing or other purposes, shall be either of the pointer type or of the counter type, and shall comply with the following requirements :—

Registering mechanism.

(a) A registering mechanism of the pointer type shall comply with the relevant clause of B.S.S. No. 37 current at the date of purchase of the meter.

(b) A registering mechanism of the counter type shall be of such type as may be approved by the Governor.

5. The meter shall not register at no load and its error, at the standard or marked voltage and frequency and at any temperature to which it may be subjected in service, shall not exceed the following values :—

Provided that this Rule shall not preclude the certification or use, for registration at loads outside the ranges of current and power factor quoted above, of a meter which registers at such loads within the limits of error prescribed above.

LOCUST REPORT, 26TH JULY, 1935.

THE RED LOCUST.

Kenya.

Numerous swarms of locusts are still present in the Colony. One large and a few small ones have entered South Kavirondo from Tanganyika and reached Kericho, but the main infestation remains in or is approaching the Central Province from the Masai District. Flight is rapid, and the general direction in South Kavirondo is north-east, and in the Central Province north-west. Some swarms previously reported in the latter Province have now reached Rumuruti, and it is stated that they are being followed in that area by large numbers of birds.

Locusts have not been reported from the Northern Frontier District, but at least one small swarm, stated to be flying southward, is known to have reached the Tana River, 35 miles above Garisa.

Damage to crops has been negligible, and as cereals in districts concerned are well advanced, it is not anticipated that much loss will be caused.

Forecast.—As the wave of locusts which arrived from the south at the end of June has been followed by others at regular intervals, and large swarms moving northward are located at the north-west end of the Usambara Mountains in Tanganyika, it is anticipated that the infestation in Kenya will

continue for the present. The absence of signs of disease in the locusts in the Colony also makes this outlook more probable.

Tanganyika and Uganda.

Reports state that, although swarms are still present in many parts of Tanganyika, the infestation is declining. Disease is causing deaths in the Tanga and other Provinces, and crops are practically safe. If fresh invasion occurs during the next few months cotton is the only important crop which may suffer.

Reports from Uganda are very favourable, and but few locusts now remain.
