GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 629

OVERSEAS SCHOLARSHIPS SCHEME.

EXPENDITURE of £100 on the above scheme, which was included in this year's Budget, has received the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies. It is proposed to use this money in making grants to provide further education beyond the secondary stage for Kenya children with a view to assisting them to obtain professional qualifications for a career either in Kenya or elsewhere.

Assistance will be limited to the children of parents domiciled in Kenya who have resided continuously in the Colony for a minimum period of ten years. Absence from the Colony for purposes of health or holidays not to be deemed to break continuous residence, provided that the total period of absence during the ten years does not exceed three years. Candidates for assistance must have completed five years' continuous attendance at a Kenya school or schools.

Applications for grants should be addressed to the Director of Education, P.O. Box No. 340, Nairobi, and posted to reach him before the 30th September, 1935. Full details of the parents' financial position should be given, in addition to details of the candidate's scholastic attainments and the courses of study which it is proposed should be followed.

THE RED LOCUST.

Kenya.

No locusts have been reported in the Colony during the past fortnight. A small swarm entered the Machakos District during August, flying in a north-westerly direction, but passed out of the district without doing damage. Locusts reported at Kericho on 21st August have been found to be immature and apparently free from disease.

Forecast.—There is no reason at present to change the view expressed in the last report that damage to crops by locusts during the next few months is improbable.

A small swarm is reported to be flying easterly between Moshi and Taveta, otherwise the Moshi area is stated to be clear.
