TENDERS FOR GRANT OF HOTEL PLOT, KISII.

TENDERS are invited for the grant of a plot in Kisii Township specified in the Schedule hereto. The site has not yet been surveyed, but it will be pointed out to any intending tenderer on application to the District Commissioner, Kisii. The area of the site will be approximately 8 acres.

- 2. A sketch plan of the plot may be seen at the Public Map Office, Survey and Registration Division, Nairobi, or at the Office of the District Commissioner, Kisii, or may be had on application to the Surveyor General, Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free.
- 3. The grantee of the plot will be required to erect on the plot within two years from the commencement of the grant a main hotel building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations.
- 4. The plot may be used for the purposes of an hotel only and purposes ancillary thereto.
- 5. No building shall be erected on the plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof, shall have been previously approved by the Local Authority, and by the Provincial Commissioner, Nyanza Province, Kisumu, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kisii, for necessary action.
- 6. The term of the grant will be 33 years from the 1st day of November, 1935, and the grant will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition).
- 7. The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous consent of the Governor.
- 8. The grantee of the plot shall pay to the District Commissioner, Kisii, within seven days of the acceptance of his tender 25 per cent of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1935. In the default of such payment the sale of the plot may be cancelled.
- 9. The balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Kisii, while the survey fees, the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 110), and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Surveyor General, Nairobi. All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a request for payment being made, when the grant is ready for execution. If these amounts be not paid within the time stated, the Chief Native Commissioner may order the deposit made by the grantee to be forfeited, and the grantee shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.
- 10. No tender less than the amount stated in the Schedule hereto will be considered.
- 11. Tenders in writing must be submitted to the District Commissioner, Kisii, in sealed envelopes marked "Tender for Kisii Hotel Plot" on or before the 23rd day of October, 1935.

- 12. Tenderers should submit in triplicate, with their tender, full details of their proposals for the development of the plot, sketch plans of their proposed buildings, stating the materials to be used and proposals for the layout of the ground. Financial guarantees and evidence of capital should also be submitted.
- 18. The highest of any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
- 14. In considering applications, regard will be given to the initial amount of capital proposed to be expended, the accommodation to be provided, and the date by which the hotel will be opened.

LOCUST REPORT, 25TH SEPTEMBER, 1935. THE RED LOCUST.

Kenya.

Since the last report was issued, a number of swarms of the red locust have been reported in the Colony.

Northern Frontier Province.

A small swarm was present over Bura, Garissa District, on 2nd August. It arrived from the southwest, and after doing a little damage, left in a north-east direction; presumably it was this same swarm which passed over Wajir on the following day, still heading north-east.

Central Province.

A dense swarm of locusts, perhaps half a mile long and a quarter of a mile wide, was observed at Il Melile in the Narok District on 5th September.

Small swarms were reported to be in Remongi's and Waweru's Locations, Kiambu District, on 18th September. These swarms were not moving to any great extent, and were doing considerable damage to young wattle plantations.

Nyanza Province.

A small swarm of locusts was seen between Lumbwa and Tunnel stations on 12th September. This swarm had exhibited no great movement for four days.

A swarm passed through Jamji, Kericho, on 16th September, flying towards Central Kavirondo.

One of these swarms, at least, is some five or six miles long.

Rift Valley Province.

A swarm was reported to have flown over Gilgil on 15th September, moving towards Lake Elmenteita; probably it was this swarm which was stated to be present at Eburru on 17th September. Little damage was said to have been done by this swarm at the time of reporting.

Forecast.—Examination of locusts from Kericho revealed slight ovarian development, and these insects may be expected to lay towards the end of October. Stragglers collected from a swarm which passed over the Lumbwa road some five miles from Kericho on 21st September showed infestation by nematodes.

Specimens derived from the swarm at Eburru showed a colour change commencing, which indicates that this swarm, also, may be expected to arrive at the laying stage soon after the commencement of the short rains.

Arrangements are being made by the Department of Agriculture for a free supply of locust bait to be available as in previous years, in case a hopper campaign is necessitated.


