KENYA DEFENCE FORCE.
ARMS, AMMUNITION AND EQUIPMENT.
NOTICE.

THE Commandant, the Kenya Defence Force, has issued orders from time to time for the collection and centralization of arms, ammunition and equipment, etc., including such issues as have been made to individuals at various districts throughout the Colony.

- 2. The object of these orders was to carry out a check on all Government property on charge of the Kenya Defence Force. Although this check has been in progress for the past 18 months, the collection of arms, ammunition, and equipment, etc., has not yet been completed.
- 3. Notice is hereby given that any member of the Kenya Defence Force, past or present, in possession of any Government property referred to in paragraph 1 above, or to whose charge any Government property referred to in paragraph 1 above has been committed, must return same to one of the undermentioned units by the 31st December, 1935:—
 - (1) Defence Force Headquarters, Nairobi.
 - (2) The nearest Kenya Defence Force District Headquarters.
 - (3) The nearest Police Station.
- 4. With effect from the first of January, 1936, drastic action will be taken under Regulation 15 of the Defence Force Regulations, 1930, against any member of the Kenya Defence Force who is found in possession of or to whose charge has been committed a Government rifle or other property issued through the Defence Force and who has not returned, in compliance with this order, such Government rifle or other property so issued.
- 5. An extract from Regulation 15 of the Defence Force Regulations is published below:
 - "Any member of the Defence Force who fails to return any arm, ammunition, accountement, uniform of other appointment supplied to him or any Government property committed to his charge when ordered to do so shall be

- deemed to have committed an offence against discipline, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds."
- 6. Any person in possession of a Government rifle issued for the purpose of Rifle Club shooting must furnish the following particulars to Defence Force Headquarters, Nairobi, by the 31st December, 1935:—

(a) Full name and address;

- (b) Designation of Rifle Club through which the rifle was obtained;
- (c) Date of issue;
- (d) Rifle breech number.

TENDERS by way of royalty are invited for concessions to collect Bêche-de-mer on the coast of the Kenya Protectorate within the following three areas:---

Area No. 1.—The foreshore from the Tanganyika boundary, near Vanga, to the mouth of Kilindini Harbour.

Area No. 2.—The foreshore from the mouth of Kilindini Harbour to Kipini.

Area No. 3.—The foreshore from Kipini to the boundary of Italian Territory near Ras Kiambone or Dick's Head.

In each case the area will include the foreshore of the islands adjacent thereto.

Each concession will be for a term of three years from 1st December, 1935, to 30th November, 1938.

No tender by way of royalty of less than Sh. 15 per bag of 150 lb. collected will be accepted, and the amount of royalty payable will be subject to revision after the 30th day of the month of November in each successive year of the term of each concession. Royalty shall be payable to the Commissioner of Customs upon production for export.

It will be a condition of the concession for each area that the licensee shall collect at least 7,000 pounds weight of Bêche-de-mer during each year of the term of the concession.

Successful tenderers will be required to enter into agreements ensuring the proper working of their concessions, and providing for forfeiture in the event of collections being inadequate; and to pay the cost of preparation of the agreements, and the necessary stamp duty thereon, within one month of a request in writing.

Annual Course of Training, 1935.

IT is hereby notified that all Airican ranks on the King's African Rifles (Kenya) Reserve, other than those called up for training in October, 1939, are called up for the annual course of one month's training from the 1st to 30th November, 1935.
