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### SUPPLEMENT

Kenya Proclamations, Rules and Regulations (No. 41)

Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Restriction on use of title of quantity surveyor.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided, after the expiration architect and of six months from the date of the coming into operation of this Ordinance no person shall practise under any name, title or style containing the word architect, architecture, architectural, quantity surveyor or quantity surveying unless he is in terms of this Ordinance registered as an architect or as a quantity surveyor, as the case may be:

> Provided that nothing in this Ordinance shall preclude a member of the Royal Institute of British Architects or a chartered quantity surveyor of the Chartered Surveyors' Institution or a member of any other institute which the Governor in Council may by proclamation declare to be of adequate standing from so practising in an advisory or consulting capacity only:

> Provided further that nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to any person in the service of the Government of the Colony or of the High Commissioner for Transport, or to any person who, for the purpose of preparing any particular piece of work for the Government of the Colony or for the High Commissioner for Transport, may be exempted by the Governor in Council from the provisions of this Ordinance.

### A Bill to Amend the Architects and Quantity Surveyors Ordinance, 1933.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Architects and Short title. Quantity Surveyors (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Architects and Quantity Surveyors Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of the first proviso thereto which is set out in lines eight to fourteen (inclusive) thereof.

Repeal of the first proviso to section 2 of the Principal Ordinance.

Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

Qualifications for registration as an architect.

- 9. No person shall after the expiration of a period of six months from the date of the coming into operation of this Ordinance be registered as an architect unless he shall at the date of his application for membership have attained the age of twenty-two years and paid the registration fee as provided by the by-laws and either—
  - (a) have passed a qualifying examination approved by the Board and have had not less than five years' practical training or articled pupilage in the work of an architect either in the Colony or in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or in some British possession or British Dominion or British Protectorate or any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being exercised by His Majesty's Government; or
  - (b) be entitled to vote as a member of the Royal Institute of British Architects or of such other institute as the Governor in Council may by proclamation declare to be of adequate standing; or
  - (c) have been an assistant or articled pupil to an architect in the Colony for a continuous period of five years prior to the date of his application and have passed such examination as the Board may determine.

Qualifications for registration as a quantity surveyor. 11. No person shall after the expiration of a period of six months from the date of the coming into operation of this Ordinance be registered as a quantity surveyor unless he shall at the date of his application for membership have attained the age of twenty-two years, and paid the registration fee as provided by the by-laws, and either—

Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace:—

Exemption of persons holding certain qualifications.

- 18. (1) Nothing in this Ordinance contained, except the provisions of section 2, shall be construed so as to prevent any person to whom any one of the descriptions set out in the Schedule hereto applies from performing any function or exercising any power which he might lawfully have performed or exercised if this Ordinance had not been passed.
- (2) The Governor in Council may from time to time, by notification in the Gazette, at his discretion extend the Schedule hereto so as to include therein any person to whom a diploma evidencing technical ability has been granted by any association, whether British or foreign, which is similar in character to any of the associations mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It has been pointed out to Government that certain of the provisions of the Principal Ordinance, notably sections 9 (b) and 11 (b) thereof, are contrary to the stipulations of Article 3 of the Convention of Saint Germain-en-Laye, which provides, inter alia, that there shall be no discrimination in the matter of practice of their professions towards nationals of one of the signatory powers to the Convention when practising in the territory of another of the signatory powers. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance and the Schedule referred to therein also present difficulties in their present form in connection with Article 3 of the Convention, as does the first proviso to section 2 of the Principal Ordinance.

Accordingly the sections above referred to of the Principal Ordinance are amended by this Bill in such a way that the provisions of the above-mentioned Article 3 of the Convention of Saint Germain-en-Laye are not infringed.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

### KING'S SCHOOL, CANTERBURY.

MILNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS.

FIVE Milner Memorial Scholarships have recently been founded at the King's School, Canterbury, under a Trust Deed, out of funds collected by the Lord Milner Memorial Committee, to perpetuate the memory of the work done for the British Empire by the late Lord Milner. Their value is £100 a year for five years, and one Scholarship will be awarded each year. Candidates must be over 13 and under 14 years of age on 24th June, 1936. These Scholarships are open to boys of British parentage and European descent—

- (i) whose fathers are or have been members of the permanent establishment of the Civil Services in India, the Colonies not possessing responsible Government, Protectorates or the territories administered under mandate by His Majesty's Government in Great Britain, or in Iraq, Egypt, or the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan; or
- (ii) whose fathers not being or having been members of the permanent establishment nevertheless have been continuously employed in any such service for a period of not less than ten years; or
- (iii) whose parents or surviving parent reside in some part of the British Empire where facilities for secondary education are for the time being insufficient or inadequate.

In awarding these Scholarships, account will be taken of intellectual ability, as decided by a brief written examination; character; the financial circumstances of the parent or guardian.

Candidates selected for competition will be examined in Kenya in June, 1936, in Latin grammar, sentences and translation (with dictionaries); French translation and grammar; Mathematics (arithmetic, geometry and algebra); General information (Scripture, English literature, nature study, English history, and geography, with special reference to the British Empire).

Applications regarding candidates from Kenya should be made to the Director of Education at Nairobi not later than 31st December, 1935.
