#### A Bill to Amend the Police Ordinance, 1930.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Police (Amend- Short title. ment No. 2) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Police Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the No. 64 of 1930. Principal Ordinance.
- 2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding Amendment of immediately after section 28 thereof the following new the Princip Ordinance. section :--

"28A. Where a police officer is carrying out the Police officer duties of a prison officer, every police officer while engaged in any such duty shall be deemed to be a prison in certain officer, and shall have all the powers, protections and privileges attaching thereto."

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to make quite clear that when a police officer is engaged on duties that would normally be carried out by a prisons officer, such police officer shall be deemed to be a prison officer and shall have all the powers, protection and privileges attaching thereto under the Prisons Ordinance, 1930.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Amount of Customs and Excise Revenue payable to Uganda.

3. There shall be payable annually to the Government of the Uganda Protectorate a sum which bears the same proportion to the net revenue collected by the combined department as the net total duty collected on goods retained in the Uganda Protectorate bears to the net total duty collected.

#### A Bill to Amend the Customs and Excise Revenue Allocation Ordinance, 1927.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs and Short title Excise Revenue Allocation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and commencement. and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise Revenue Allocation Ordinance, 1927, hereinafter referred to as the No. 10 of 1927. Principal Ordinance, and shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1936.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance, as repealed and Amendment of replaced by the Customs Revenue Allocation (Amendment) the Principal Ordinance, 1933, is hereby amended by the addition thereto Ordinance. No. 37 of 1933. of the following:-

section 3 of

"For the purposes of this section the expression 'goods retained in the Uganda Protectorate' shall include goods re-exported from the Uganda Protectorate on which no drawback of duty is paid."

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This amending Bill is designed to modify the existing procedure under the Customs and Excise Revenue Allocation Ordinance whereby Uganda is debited with duty in respect of goods re-exported on which no drawback is due or claimed. It is desired that the benefit of such duty in respect of Uganda transactions should accrue to Uganda.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law. A certain loss of revenue will, however, accrue, and the Commissioner of Customs is having an estimate of this loss prepared.

Section 39 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Duration of Ordinance.

39. (1) This Ordinance shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, 1935, and shall then expire:

Provided that such expiry shall not affect any liability, penalty or punishment incurred under this Ordinance or any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such liability, penalty or punishment, but any such legal proceeding or remedy may be carried on or sought as if this Ordinance had not expired.

Repeal. Cap. 52.

(2) The Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance is hereby repealed, but, on the expiry of this Ordinance, the provisions of the said Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance shall revive and be of full force and effect.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Non-Native Poll Short title. Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter No. 61 of 1934. referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 39 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended in the following respects:

(a) By the deletion of the figures "1935" from the second Ordinance. line of sub-section (1) thereof, and by the substitution therefor of the figures "1936".

(b) By the insertion of the word "investigation" in each case after the word "any" in the second line and after the word "such" in the fourth line of the proviso to sub-section (1) thereof.

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended in the Amendment of following respects:

the Principal Ordinance.

- (a) By the deletion of the figures "1934" wherever they occur in the Ordinance (save where the reference is to the short title of the Ordinance) and by the substitution therefor in each case of the figures "1935".
- (b) By the deletion of the figures "1935" wherever they occur in the Ordinance and by the substitution therefor in each case of the figures "1936".

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This amending Bill extends the date for the expiry of the Non-Native Poll Tax Ordinance, 1934, to the 31st day of December, 1936, and makes the necessary consequential amendments in the Ordinance.

For the removal of doubts the opportunity has been taken to add the word "investigation" to section 39.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
