Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace :—

Duration of
licence.

8. A licence may be issued for one year or half a year or quarter of a year. Every half-yearly licence shall continue in force from the date of the granting thereof until the next following thirtieth day of June or thirty-first day of December, whichever shall first ensue, and every quarterly licence shall continue in force from the date of the granting thereof until the next following thirty-first day of March, thirtieth day of June, thirtieth day of September or thirty-first day of December, whichever shall first ensue, and every yearly licence shall continue in force from the date of the granting thereof until the next following thirty-first day of December :

Proviso.

Provided that the fee payable in respect of every half-yearly licence shall be fifty-five per cent of the fee payable in respect of every yearly licence and the fee payable in respect of every quarterly licence shall be thirty per cent of the fee payable in respect of every yearly licence.

A Bill to Amend the Traffic Ordinance, 1928.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 26 of 1928.

2. Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

Repeal and replacement of section 8 of the Principal Ordinance.

“Duration of licence.

8. (1) A licence may be issued—

- (a) for one year; or
- (b) for half a year; or
- (c) for a quarter of a year; or
- (d) for any one calendar month in a year.

Provided that licences under paragraph (d) of this sub-section shall be issued only in respect of motor vehicles and at the absolute discretion of the licensing officer.

(2) Licences shall continue in force as follows, from the date of the granting thereof :—

- (a) a yearly licence, until the next following thirty-first day of December;
- (b) a half-yearly licence, until the next following thirtieth day of June or thirty-first day of December, whichever shall first ensue;
- (c) a quarterly licence, until the next following thirty-first day of March, thirtieth day of June, thirtieth day of September or thirty-first day of December, whichever shall first ensue;

It is hereby ordered that the following

shall be the rules and regulations governing the

conduct of the said office.

(d) a monthly licence, until the last day of the month in which the licence was granted.

(3) Fees calculated at the following rates, which are expressed as percentages of the yearly licence fees set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance, shall be payable in respect of licences :—

(a) fifty-five per cent in respect of a half-yearly licence;

(b) thirty per cent in respect of a quarterly licence;

(c) twelve-and-a-half per cent in respect of a monthly licence."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill amends the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, so as to provide for the issue of monthly licences for motor vehicles.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

Liability to be called out and extent of service.

7. Every reservist shall be liable to be called out by the officer commanding the troops as follows :—

(1) For training and exercises at such places and for such times not exceeding thirty-one days in any one year as may be directed;

A Bill to Amend the King's African Rifles Reserve Forces Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the King's African Rifles Reserve Forces (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, and shall be read as one with the King's African Rifles Reserve Forces Ordinance (Chapter 41 of the Revised Edition) hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

Cap. 41.

2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, next after section 3, the following as section 3A :—

Amendment of the Principal Ordinance. Enlistment of men without previous service.

“3A. (1) Notwithstanding anything in this Ordinance contained, the Governor in Council, upon the recommendation of the officer commanding the troops, may from time to time by notice in the Gazette authorize the enlistment in the reserve of men who have had no previous service in the King's African Rifles.

(2) Every such notice shall specify the period of training and exercises for which men so enlisted shall be liable to be called out in any one year, and it shall not be necessary in any such notice to limit such training and exercises to the maximum period provided for in sub-section (1) of section 7 of this Ordinance.

(3) Save where a contrary intention is in this Ordinance expressed, all the provisions of this Ordinance, in so far as they are not inconsistent with this section, shall apply to men enlisted in the reserve under this section.”

3. Sub-section (1) of section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after the word “exceeding” in the second line thereof, the words and brackets—

Amendment of section 7 (1) of the Principal Ordinance.

“(save in the case of men enlisted under section 3A of this Ordinance)”.

(2) In aid of the civil power ;

(3) On permanent service within or without the Colony in case of insurrection, hostilities or emergency whenever the Governor may think fit.

Every reservist called out under the provisions of subsections (2) and (3) hereof shall be liable to continue such service for any period not exceeding twelve months beyond the term of his enlistment so long as such insurrection, hostilities or other emergency continues or continue.

Sub-section (2) of section 13 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace :—

(2) Any reservist who commits an offence under this section or under section thirty-seven (6) and (7) of the King's African Rifles Ordinance whether otherwise subject to that Ordinance or not shall be liable as follows, that is to say :—

(a) To be tried by regimental court-martial and on conviction to suffer imprisonment of either description not exceeding two years or such less punishment as in the King's African Rifles Ordinance is mentioned or to be dealt with summarily by his commanding officer according to section forty of that Ordinance ;

(b) To be dealt with by a magistrate and if convicted sentenced to imprisonment of either description not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding fifteen pounds.

Sub-section (3) of section 17 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend :—

17. Every reservist who when not subject to the King's African Rifles Ordinance as in section ten hereof provided :—

(3) Fails without reasonable excuse to comply with any rules or orders lawfully made or given, shall be liable on conviction by his commanding officer to any of the punishments provided under section forty of the King's African Rifles Ordinance, or on conviction by a magistrate to imprisonment of either description not exceeding six weeks or to a fine not exceeding one pound.

4. Section 13 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting sub-section (2) therefrom and by substituting therefor the following sub-section:—

“(2) Any reservist who commits an offence under this section or under sections 13, 14, 15 or 16 of the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932, whether otherwise subject to that Ordinance or not, shall be liable—

No. 48 of 1932.

(a) to be tried by court-martial and, if convicted, to suffer imprisonment or such less punishment as is mentioned in the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932; or

No. 48 of 1932.

(b) to be dealt with summarily by his commanding officer according to section 46 of the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932; or

No. 48 of 1932.

(c) to be dealt with by a magistrate and, if convicted, to be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not exceeding two years or to a fine not exceeding fifteen pounds.”

5. Sub-section (3) of section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended in the following respects—

(a) by deleting the word “forty” from the fourth line thereof and by substituting therefor the figures “46”; and

(b) by deleting the words “of either description” from the sixth line thereof and by substituting therefor the words “for a period”.

6. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words “King's African Rifles Ordinance” wherever they occur therein and by substituting therefor in each case the words and figures “King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932”.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Under the provisions of the King's African Rifles Reserve Forces Ordinance (Chapter 41) the King's African Rifles Reserve consists only of men who have previously served in the King's African Rifles. This Bill enables the Governor in Council from time to time to authorize the enlistment in the reserve of men with no previous service, if the officer commanding the troops recommends such a course.

2. The opportunity has been taken to amend certain sections in the Principal Ordinance which contain references to the former King's African Rifles Ordinance.

3. No expenditure of public moneys outside the existing provision for the King's African Rifles Reserve will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 861

(Sgd.) GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come: Greeting!

WHEREAS We have taken into Our Royal consideration the long and good services rendered by subordinate members of the Police Forces and Fire Brigades in Our Colonies and in Territories under Our Protection:

AND WHEREAS We are desirous of distinguishing such long and good services by some mark of Our Royal favour:

We do by these presents for Us, Our heirs and successors, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded in recognition of such services.

2. The Medal shall be designated and styled "The Colonial Police and Fire Brigades Long Service Medal".

3. The Colonial Police and Fire Brigades Long Service Medal shall consist of a circular medal of silver with Our Effigy on the obverse, and on the reverse an emblematic design, with the words "For Long Service and Good Conduct" and the circumscription "Colonial Police Forces" or "Colonial Fire Brigades".

4. The name and rank of the recipient of the Medal and the Force in which he completed the requisite period of qualifying service shall be inscribed on the rim of the Medal.

5. The Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a ribbon one inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one half of an inch in width) shall be green, with two borders, each three-eighths of an inch in width, dark blue, and two silver stripes, each one-sixteenth of an inch wide, separating the borders from the central part. In the case of awards to members of Fire Brigades the central part shall be divided by a further silver stripe one-sixteenth of an inch wide.

6. The Medal shall be awarded only to subordinate officers and constables of the Police Forces, and to persons holding equivalent positions and rendering whole-time service in properly organized Fire Brigades, in Our Colonies and in Territories under Our Protection who have completed not less than eighteen years' qualifying service as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned.

7. No person shall qualify for the award of the Medal who has not been granted an exemplary character as defined in the regulations hereinafter mentioned, and who has not been recommended by the Officer in Command of the Police Force or Fire Brigade in which he is or was serving after completion of the requisite period of qualifying service.

8. The Medal shall be awarded in Our Name and on Our behalf by Our Governor or Officer Administering the Government of the Colony or Territory in which the period of service requisite to qualify for the Medal has been completed, in accordance with such regulations as to the grant, forfeiture, restoration and other matters, in amplification of the provisions of this Our Warrant, as may be issued or approved from time to time by Our

Governor or Officer Administering the Government with the prior approval of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

9. We reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.
