AUCTION OF FARMS

THE grants of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Laws of Kenya), be offered for sale at the Railway Institute, Nairobi, commencing at 10 am, on Friday, 27th March, 1936
