A Bill to Amend the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1932

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1932 hereinafter referred to No 43 of 1932 as the Principal Ordinance

2 Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed Repeal and and the following is substituted therefor —

replacement of section 9 of the Principal Ordinance

"9 No person shall import or bring into or export Prohibition of from the Colony any Indian hemp, or any resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, or any products of which such resin forms the base (excluding such products which are used solely for medicinal purposes)

importation and exportation of Indian hemp and of the resin from the plant cannabis sutiva and of the products of which such resin

forms the base

Provided that where such Indian hemp, or such resin or such products are imported or brought into the Colony solely for the purpose of transit (including deviation) through the Colony or are exported from the Colony immediately after having been brought into the Colony for such purpose, such goods shall not be deemed to have been imported, or brought into, or exported from the Colony within the meaning of this section "

- Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal and repealed and the following is substituted therefor —
 - "10 If any person—
 - (a) produces, sells or otherwise deals in Indian hemp, or resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, or any products of which such resin forms the base, or

replacement of section 10 of the Principal Ordinance Penalty for selling, etc, the plant cannabis sativa and the resin therefrom

- (c) cultivates the plant cannabis sativa, or
- (d) sells or otherwise deals in the whole or any portion of the plant $cannabis\ sativa$ (excluding its medicinal preparations), or
- (e) has in his possession the whole or any portion of the plant cannabis sativa (excluding its medicinal preparations),

he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance

- (b) has in his possession any Indian hemp, or any resin from the plant cannabis sativa, or any products of which such resin forms the base, except when such Indian hemp, or such resin, or such products as aforesaid are in transit through the Colony, whether by land, or by air, or by water, or
- (c) cultivates the plant cannabis sativa, or
- (d) sells or otherwise deals in the whole or any portion of the plant cannabis sativa (excluding its medicinal preparations), or
- (e) has in his possession the whole or any portion of the plant cannabis sativa (excluding its medicinal preparations),

he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance "

- The following section, to be numbered 10A, shall be deemed to be inserted immediately after section 10 of the Principal Ordinance, as follows —
 - "104 The Governor in Council may make Rules for controlling or restricting the possession of or dealing in Indian hemp, or resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, or products of which such resin forms the base while regarding such Indian hemp, or such resin, or such products is or are in transit through the Colony whether by land, or by air, or by water "

Power to Governor in Council to nake Rules Indian hemp, etc, while in transit through the Colony

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance with regard to the treatment and conditions relating to the importation and exportation of Indian hemp, and, in this respect, brings the Principal Ordinance into line with international legislation

Clause 2 of the Bill, in which is set out the section which is to replace the present section 9 of the Principal Ordinance, forbids the importation into or the export from the Colony of any Indian hemp, or any resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, or any products of which cannabis sativa forms the base (excluding such products which are used solely for medicinal purposes), and provision is also made that this prohibition shall not apply to goods in transit through the Colony

Clause 3 of the Bill, in which is set out the section which is to replace the present section 10 of the Principal Ordinance makes the selling, possession of and dealing with Indian hemp, or resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, or any products of which such resin forms the base, an offence against the Ordinance, except that possession is allowed when such Indian hemp, or such resin, or such products, are in transit through the Colony Cultivation of the plant cannabis sativa and the selling or otherwise dealing therein (excluding medical preparations) is prohibited, as is also the possession of the whole or any portion of the plant cannabis sativa

A new section 10a is added to the Principal Ordinance providing that the Governor in Council may make Rules for the controlling, etc., of Indian hemp, resin obtained from the plant cannabis sativa, and products of such resin, while the same are in transit through the Colony

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

THE following telegrams received by His Excellency the Governor from the Secretary of State for the Colonics are notified for general information—

'The following message has been addressed by His Majesty —

(a) To the Royal Navy

On succeeding to the Throne I desire that the Royal Navy and ill My other Naval Forces throughout the Emphe should know with what gratitude I recal the distinguished services rendered by them during the reign of the King My Beloved Father and how much I cherish the recollection of the personal mumite association so long subsisting between My Family and that profession to which My Father devoted His youth and early minhood and in which I and two of My brothers received Our early training

My visits to many parts of the Empire have enabled Me to note with pride that loyalty and devotion to duty remain the watch words of the Royal Navy wherever it is called upon to serve and that the same great traditions are guiding the development of the Naval Services of the Dominions and India and of all other Forces sharing in the Naval Defence of the British Commonwealth of Nations

Conscious as I am of the great trust reposed in you and confident of your determination never to disappoint that trust I shall always regard your efficiency and well being as matters of the highest importance and shall take a deep interest in everything which concerns them

(b) To the Army

'I desire on My accession to the Throne to express My thanks to the Army for its devoted services to My Beloved Father. I recall with gratitude the noble response which the Army made during the Great War to His proud confidence in its loyalty, valour and steadfastness. Its welfare was ever in His thoughts

My Own association with the Army is now of long standing. I look back to My service as a young officer in the Great War as one of the most valuable experiences of My life. It gave Me the opportunity and privilege of comiadeship with soldiers drawn from the United Kingdom, from the Dominions, from India and from the Colonies. I learned to understand and to appreciate those essential characteristics which united them in the sternest crisis of our history, the same fervent attachment to the Crown, the same good humour and endurance in adversity and the same determination to uphold the tradition of chivalry and courage which are our common inheritance.

In happier days of peace I have been able to see by personal visits to the Military Forces of the Crown both at home and abroad and have everywhere noted with pride the same gallant bearing which distinguished those Forces in the field

I shall be strengthened in the discharge of the great responsibilities which lie before Me by the confidence with which I know I can rely on the unswerving allegiance of all ranks of the Military Forces of the Crown throughout the Empire

(c) To the Royal Air Force

'On my accession to the Throne I desire at once to address a message to the Air Forces at home and overseas. The Flying Services were first created during the reign of My Beloved Father and it was with close personal interest that He watched their rapid growth from small beginnings—their unification under the stress of War—and their subsequent development into a powerful instrument of defence which shares with the older services the honourable duty of safeguarding these shores and the Empire

I have ever valued My close association with the Royal Air Force marked of recent years by a special connection with the Auxiliary Air Force as its Honorary Air Commodore in Chief. I have also witnessed with deep satisfaction the creation of the Air Forces of the Dominions and of India. If the Air Forces of the Empire are young, they have all the vigour of youth, and in the space of a few years they have already achieved a high tradition. I shall watch their further progress with a keen personal solicitude for their weifare and with entire confidence that they will ever show that pride of service and unswerving loyalty to the Crown which they have displayed since their first inception.






