Interpretation

4 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"District Commissioner" means the district officer in charge of a district, and includes any district officer appointed by the Provincial Commissioner to exercise the powers of a District Commissioner under this Ordinance,

"tribesman" means a member of any tribe resident or being within the district or area to which this Ordinance has been applied, and includes a Somali,

"arbitral tribunal" means a tribunal established under this Ordinance

Passports to be carried while leaving areas

18 No person shall leave the district or area to which this Ordinance has been applied unless such person is in possession of a valid passport or other document satisfactorily establishing his identity issued to him in such form and under such conditions as the Governor in Council may from time to time prescribe

A Bill to Amend the Special Districts (Administration) Ordinance, 1934

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Special Districts Short title. (Administration) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Special Districts (Administration) Ordi- No 13 of 1934 nance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment amended by the deletion therefrom of the definition of "tribes- of section 4 man" and by the substitution therefor of the following Principal definition—

Ordinance

'tribesman' means any male person who by birth or adoption belongs to any tribe resident or being within a district or an area to which this Ordinance has been applied, and includes a Somali "

Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment amended by the deletion of the word "person" from the first of section 18 and second lines thereof and by the substitution therefor, in Principal each case, of the word "tubesman"

Ordinance

Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to repeal —

General penalty

Any person who is guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this Ordinance in respect of which no penalty is specifically provided shall be liable, on conviction before a subordinate court of the first or second class, to a fine of one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment

Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby re- Repeal and pealed and the following section is substituted therefor —

replacement of section 22 of the Principal Ordinance

- "22 (1) Any person who contravenes or fails to Offences comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules made thereunder, or who fails to observe the conditions or restrictions subject to or upon which any permit, order, licence, passport or other document has been issued under such Ordinance or Rules, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance
- (2) Any person who is guilty of an offence against General this Ordinance for which no penalty is specially provided shall be liable, on conviction by a subordinate court of the first or second class, to a fine of one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, or to both such fine and imprisonment "

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Experience has shown the advisability of introducing into the Special Districts (Administration) Ordinance, 1934, a more accurate definition of "tribesman".

- 2 This Bill makes the necessary amendment, and further limits the application of the passport requirements of the Ordinance to tribesmen
- 3 The opportunity has been taken to effect a minor amendment to the wording of the section relating to penalties
- 4 No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 18 of the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, I give notice to all persons interested that the Municipal Board of Mombasa has imposed the following rates in respect of the year 1936 —

- 1 An original rate of one-half of one per centum, and
- 2 An additional rate of three-fourteenths of one per centum upon the unimproved value of land as appearing in the Valuation Roll, making in all five-sevenths of one per centum, and further
- 3 A rate of thirteen-fiftieths of one per centum upon the value of improvements as appearing in the Valuation Roll

Provided that the Board may find it necessary to declare a further rate later in the year

The above rates shall become due and payable at the Municipal Offices on the 23rd day of May, 1936

The Board will allow discount at the rate of two and one-half per centum on all rates paid on or before the due date where payment is made by cheque dated the 23rd May, 1936, or earlier, and the cheque is received not later than the 24th May, 1936, the full discount will be allowed

Under section 19 (3) of the Ordinance, the Board is empowered to charge and collect interest on arrear assessment rates at a rate not exceeding one per centum per month. Such interest will be payable from the 1st June, 1936. Assessment rates are a debt to the Municipal Board and although every effort will be made to deliver to those hable demand notes stating the amount due, the failure so to deliver will not be held to absolve the debtor from any disability or penalty attaching to non-payment.

GRAIN CONDITIONING PLANT, KILINDINI

TREATMENT OF BEANS

BEANS are received at the Conditioning Plant under the following conditions —

- 1 Owners of beans to be conditioned should notify the Chief Grader and Inspector, Department of Agriculture, Kilindini, giving full particulars as to the number of bags to be conditioned, kind of conditioning required and date of shipment, prior to delivery at the Conditioning Plant
- 2 The Chief Grader and Inspector may refuse at any time to accept beans for conditioning if in his opinion the acceptance of the consignment shall be likely to interfere with, or delay, the conditioning of maize and/or wheat
- 3 Beans will be delivered to the Conditioning Plant through the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours only Owners must supply any new bags found necessary on re-bagging Such bags must be of the kind prescribed by the "Grading of Beans" rules for the time being in force

4 Charges —

- (a) Wet Beans—Extraction of Moisture—A charge of -/60 (sixty cents) per bag will be made for beans conditioned in one operation at the Conditioning Plant, and for each subsequent treatment a charge of -/50 (fifty cents) per bag. The minimum charge shall be Sh 120
- (b) Destruction of Bean Beetle—A charge of -/60 (sixty cents) per bag will be made for beans treated for the destruction of bean beetle, with a minimum charge of Sh 120
- (c) In addition to the above charges, a charge of -/15 (fitteen cents) per bag will be made by the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Haibours. This charge will include handling from the grading sheds into truck, haulage to and from the Conditioning Plant and handling into transit sheds. Provided that where beans are consigned direct to the Conditioning Plant for treatment, the haulage charge and handling charge into transit shed shall be at the rate of -/05 (five cents) per bag
- 5 All charges, both for conditioning and handling, shall be payable to the Chief Grader and Inspector before delivery of the beans from the Conditioning Plant. The Agricultural Department may sell such quantity of the beans by auction as is calculated to be sufficient to meet all charges due to it and the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours for conditioning services.
- 6 After conditioning of the beans the Agricultural Department may deliver the beans so conditioned to the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours for storage pending export
- 7 The Government will not accept responsibility for any loss or damage that may be suffered on beans treated at the Conditioning Plant
