Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

3 The Governor may, with the concurrence of the District Road Board or other local authority concerned, by order prescribe that any road reserve or part thereof or any public road or part thereof shall be open to traffic of a particular kind or shall be closed to traffic of a particular kind or shall be closed to all traffic, and the Director of Public Works shall display in such manner and position as may seem to him best to serve the purpose required such road signs or warnings or notices or all of them as should suffice adequately to inform the public that the road reserve or part thereof or the public road or part thereof is closed, or is open only to traffic of certain kinds, or is closed to all traffic as may be prescribed in the order.

Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

4 The Director of Public Works may order the suspension of any or all traffic on any road reserve or part thereof or on any public road or part thereof for any period not exceeding one month and may authorize the placing of such notices or barriers or both as should suffice to convey to the public adequate intimation of such order and may fix times during which any particular kind of traffic may use any such road reserve or public road or part thereof.

## **A Bill to Amend the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Protection (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

**2** Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words "The Governor may, with the concurrence of the District Road Board or other local authority concerned" and by substituting therefor the following words—

Amendment of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance

"The Director of Public Works may, with the concurrence of the District Road Board or the Provincial Commissioner concerned"

**3** Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, between the word "Works" and the word "may" in the first line thereof, the words "or any person whom he may authorize in that behalf by writing under his hand"

Amendment of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance

### OBJECTS AND REASONS

The amendments proposed in this Bill are merely of a formal character and are designed to facilitate the smooth working of the Principal Ordinance

Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

9 (1) It shall be the duty of every Registrar to receive applications for registration from existing servants employed in his registration district or from persons who are desirous of entering employment as servants within his district

(2) Before registering any applicant under this section the Registrar shall satisfy himself that there are reasonable grounds for believing that such applicant is a fit and proper person to enter domestic service, and if he is so satisfied he shall register such applicant in the general register, recording therein such particulars as he has been able to learn respecting the applicant and his antecedents, and the names of any persons who certify to his respectability. The Registrar shall thereupon issue to the applicant a pocket register in which shall be entered the particulars recorded in the general register

Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace —

14 Every employer, whether resident in a registration district or not, shall, on the cessation of the engagement of a registered servant, enter in the pocket register the date and cause of the cessation of the engagement, the character of such servant, and, if the servant was dismissed, the cause of such dismissal. The employer shall also furnish to the Registrar

**A Bill to Amend the Registration of Domestic Servants Ordinance, 1928**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Domestic Servants (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Registration of Domestic Servants Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Short title

**2** Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following as sub-section (3) —

Amendment of section 9 of the Principal Ordinance

“(3) No person shall seek or accept employment as a servant in any registration district unless and until he has been registered by the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of this section, and unless he is in possession of a valid pocket register issued under sub-section (2) of this section ”

**3** Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor —

Repeal and replacement of section 14 of the Principal Ordinance

“14 (1) An employer, whether resident in a registration district or not, shall, on the cessation of the engagement of a registered servant, enter in the pocket register of such servant the date of the cessation of the engagement, and shall furnish to the Registrar for the

Particulars to be entered in pocket register on cessation of employment

for the district in which such servant is registered a copy of the particulars so entered, and such particulars shall be inserted by the Registrar in the general register unless he intends to take action under section 18 of this Ordinance

Provided that if the employer is unable to enter the particulars aforesaid owing to the loss or destruction of the pocket register, he shall report the fact to the Registrar and shall furnish him with the particulars hereinbefore required to be entered in the pocket register. The Registrar shall thereupon, at the expense of the employer, issue to the servant a duplicate pocket register in which shall be entered the particulars aforesaid

Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Power to

15 (1) If any registered servant is convicted of theft or any infamous crime or is known to the police to be leading a disorderly or disreputable life the Registrar may cancel the registration of such servant, in which case he shall also cancel the endorsement made under section 11 (b) of this Ordinance. Upon the cancellation of the registration of any servant under the provisions of this section, the pocket register issued to such servant shall be returned to the Registrar by the person in whose custody it is at the date of such cancellation

(2) It shall be lawful for the Registrar to register or re-register as the case may be, any applicant who has been

district in which such servant is registered a copy of such entry, and the particulars of such entry shall be inserted by the Registrar in the general register

(2) Any such employer when making such entry may, if he so desires, further enter in the pocket register the cause of the cessation of such engagement, together with particulars as to the character of the servant and, in cases where the servant has been dismissed, the reasons for such dismissal. A copy of any particulars so entered in accordance with this sub-section shall be furnished to the Registrar and shall be inserted by the Registrar in the general register in like manner as is provided in regard to the particulars under sub-section (1) of this section, unless the Registrar intends to take action under section 18 of this Ordinance

(3) Any particulars entered in a pocket register by an employer in accordance with sub-section (2) of this section shall be subject to the provisions of section 18 of this Ordinance

(4) If an employer is unable to enter the particulars respectively required and permitted to be entered under sub-sections (1) and (2) of this section owing to the loss or destruction of the pocket register, he shall report the fact to the Registrar and shall furnish him with the particulars so required or permitted to be entered in the pocket register. The Registrar shall thereupon, at the expense of the employer, issue to the servant a duplicate pocket register in which shall be entered the particulars aforesaid "

“(3) No person whose registration has been cancelled shall after such cancellation seek or accept employment as a servant in any registration district unless and until his pocket register has been re-issued to him and he has been permitted to re-register in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section ”

18 (1) Any employer who contravenes any of the provisions or fails to comply with any of the requirements of this Ordinance or any Rules made thereunder, or who without reasonable cause gives a registered servant an adverse character, or who enters in the pocket register of a registered servant any grave accusation against such servant which he cannot substantiate, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred shillings

(2) When any person has been convicted of the offence of giving a registered servant an adverse character without reasonable cause, or of entering in the pocket register of a registered servant any grave accusation against such servant which he cannot substantiate, the court by which he has been convicted may order that the entry in respect of which the accused has been so convicted or any part thereof shall be deleted from the servant's pocket register and from the general register

(3) Any proceedings under this section may be instituted by or at the instance of the Registrar

(4) Where an adverse character, not amounting to grave accusation, has been entered in a pocket register of a registered servant, such registered servant may within thirty days from the date of such entry bring such entry to the notice of a District Commissioner or Registrar, and it shall be lawful, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the preceding sub-sections, for such District Commissioner or Registrar, after giving the employer who gave such adverse character an opportunity of being heard, to expunge or alter such entry or any part thereof from the servant's pocket register and from the general register, without any formal trial

Section 19 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

**Offences by  
servants**

19 (1) Any servant who contravenes any of the provisions or who fails to comply with any of the requirements of this Ordinance or any Rules made hereunder shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty shillings or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment

(2) Any servant who gives false information on any matter in regard to which he is required by this Ordinance to give information to the Registrar or to any other person shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred shillings or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment

Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

**General  
offences**

20 Any person who commits any of the following acts, namely, who—

- (a) wilfully destroys or injures any register book or document, or causes any such book or document to be destroyed or injured,
- (b) falsely makes or counterfeits, or causes to be falsely made or counterfeited, any part of a register book or document,
- (c) wilfully inserts or causes to be inserted in any book or document, or certified copy thereof, any false entry,
- (d) wilfully gives a false certified copy of any entry in a register book or document or causes such certified copy to be given,
- (e) unlawfully removes any pocket register which is in the lawful custody of an employer,
- (f) continues to employ a servant to whom a pocket register has been refused or whose pocket register has been cancelled,
- (g) keeps or carries a pocket register other than the pocket register issued to him under this Ordinance,
- (h) withholds a pocket register from any servant entitled thereto, except for such reasonable period of time as is required to examine the particulars therein contained, or as provided for in section 13,

**6** Section 19 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

**7** Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words—

“shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred shillings or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment ”,

and by the substitution therefor of the words—

“ shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding two hundred shillings or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment ”

- (i) unlawfully or improperly deprives any servant of any pocket register in his possession,
- (j) at any time makes any entry whatsoever on the pocket register of a registered servant with whom he has not entered into a contract of service,
- (k) unlawfully obtains or attempts to obtain a new pocket register, from a Registrar, without first reporting to such Registrar the loss, mutilation, or destruction of any pocket register which may previously have been issued to him, or fails to report the fact that he has been previously registered,
- (l) becomes registered more than once and omits to give up to the Registrar any pocket register issued to him on previous registration which remains in his possession,

shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred shillings or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year or to both such fine and imprisonment

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

By the provisions of this amending Bill the granting of a character by an employer to a servant becomes permissive instead of mandatory, as is the case under the Principal Ordinance

The Bill further makes it an offence for an unregistered person to seek or accept employment in a registration district

The opportunity has been taken to amend the Principal Ordinance in certain minor respects

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
