Upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance, 1930, and to the Conditions of Sale having been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter, unless and until the Chief Native Commissioner can present to the purchaser the grant duly executed.
