A Bill to Amend the Nursing Sisters (Retiring Allowances) Ordinance, 1931

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Nursing Sisters Short title (Retiring Allowances) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Nursing Sisters (Retiring Allowances) Ordinance, 1931, hereinafter referred to as the Principal No 21 of 1931 Ordinance
- 2 Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor Repeal and replacement section 4 of

Repeal and replacement of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance Conditions of grant of allowance

"4 Where it is established to the satisfaction of Conditions of the Governor in Council that a nursing sister has been grant of guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct, the retiring allowance may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, be reduced or altogether withheld"

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill has been prepared at the instance of the Secretary of State in order to give effect to a recommendation of the Royal Commission on the Civil Service, regarding superannuation awards, to the effect that certificates of diligence and fidelity should no longer be required before the grant of a superannuation award

Provision is, however, made in the Bill empowering the Governor in Council, with the approval of the Secretary of State, to reduce or to withhold altogether any retiring allowance where it is established that a nursing sister has been guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
