(2) No European officer shall be granted a pension, gratuity or other allowance without a certificate from the head of his department, or, if he is himself the head of a department, from the Governor, to the effect that he has discharged the duties of his office with such diligence and fidelity as to justify the grant to him of such pension, gratuity or other allowance

(3) Where it is established to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that an European officer has been guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct, the pension, gratuity or other allowance may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, be reduced or altogether withheld

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as the European Officers' Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

**2** Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows—

(a) by deleting sub-section (2) thereof, and

(b) by renumbering sub-section (3) thereof as sub-section (2)

## **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

Sub-section (2) of section 5 of the European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, provides that no officer shall be granted a pension, gratuity or other allowance without a certificate to the effect that he has discharged the duties of his office with such diligence and fidelity as to justify the grant of such pension, gratuity or allowance

The Royal Commission on Civil Service, 1929-31, recommended that if a civil servant commits an offence, the appropriate authority should decide at the time on the proper penalty, and, if it is decided that the officer concerned should continue in service, either with or without degradation of rank, his pension on retirement should be calculated in the normal manner

To enable the policy recommended by the Royal Commission to be adopted it is necessary to repeal sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance and this Bill has been prepared to effect its repeal

The position will then be governed by the further provision, which exists in section 5 (3) of the Principal Ordinance, that where it is established to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that an officer has been guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct the pension, gratuity or other allowance may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, be reduced or altogether withheld

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as the Juveniles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Juveniles Ordinance, 1934, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Short title  
No 22 of 1934

**2** The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, between section 35 and section 36 thereof, the following new section —

Amendment of the Principal Ordinance

“35A Where a person detained in a Class II or Class III Approved School is fourteen years of age or upwards and is reported to the Governor by the Chief Inspector of Approval Schools to be incorrigible, or to be exercising a bad influence on the other inmates of the school, the Governor may commute the whole or part of the unexpired portion of his sentence to a sentence of imprisonment ”

Power to commute sentence of juvenile to sentence of imprisonment

**OBJECTS AND REASONS**

The object of this Bill is to enable a juvenile, who is detained in an approval school and who proves to be incorrigible or to be exercising a bad influence on the other inmates of the school, to be transferred to a person

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

**1** This Ordinance may be cited as the non-European Officers' Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936 Short title

**2** Section 5 of the non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932, is hereby amended as follows — Amendment of section 5 of Ordinance No 53 of 1932

- (a) by the deletion of sub-section (2),
- (b) by the deletion from the last two lines of sub-section (3) of the following expression—  
“with the approval of the Secretary of State,”  
and of the comma preceding that expression, and
- (c) by the renumbering of sub-section (3) as sub-section (2)

**OBJECTS AND REASONS**

Sub-section (2) of section 5 of the non-European Officers Pensions Ordinance, 1932, provides that no officer shall be granted a pension, gratuity or other allowance without a certificate to the effect that he has discharged the duties of his office with such diligence and fidelity as to justify the grant of such pension, gratuity or allowance

The Royal Commission on Civil Service, 1929-31, recommended that if a civil servant commits an offence, the appropriate authority should decide at the time on the proper penalty, and, if it is decided that the officer concerned should continue in service, either with or without degradation of rank, his pension on retirement should be calculated in the normal manner

To enable the policy recommended by the Royal Commission to be adopted it is necessary to repeal sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance and this Bill has been prepared to effect its repeal

The position will then be governed by the further provision, which exists in section 5 (3) of the Principal Ordinance, that where it is established to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that an officer has been guilty of negligence, irregularity or misconduct the pension, gratuity or other allowance may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, be reduced or altogether withheld

It will be seen from above that before a pension or gratuity is reduced or withheld it is necessary to obtain the approval of the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State states that while he is anxious that such approval should continue to be sought where withholding or reduction is contemplated in the case of officers who are appointed by, or whose appointments are subject to the general or special approval of, him, it is not necessary that such approval should continue to be required in the case of subordinate local officers who are appointed directly by the Colonial Government. As all non-European officers are appointed by the local Government, opportunity has been taken to amend the Principal Ordinance by the deletion of the reference to the Secretary of State's approval

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
