The "MONTHLY TRADE AND INFORMATION BULLETIN" of the Standing Board of Economic Development for July, 1936 (Vol. I, No. 1) is issued with this number

Sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to replace —

Hours of employment

5 (1) No shop assistant shall be employed in or about a shop for more than fifty hours including meal times in any one week or more than nine hours in any one day

Provided that for the purpose of stocktaking or other special emergency work that cannot be done during the usual hours, the working hours of shop assistants may be extended on days other than public holidays for periods not exceeding a total of one hundred hours in any year

A Bill to Amend the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- This Ordinance may be cited as the Shop Hours Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, hereinafter referred to as No 24 of 1925 the Principal Ordinance
- Sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance Repeal and is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor —

replacement of section 5 (1) of the Principal Ordinance

"5 (1) Save as is provided by sub-sections (3), (4) and Hours of (5) of this section no person shall employ any shop assistant---

employment of shop assistants

- (a) for more than fifty hours in any one week including intervals for meals,
- (b) for more than eight hours in any one day excluding intervals for meals to be completed within nine hours from the commencement of such assistant's work,
- (c) on more than six days in any one week, and
- (d) on any Sunday or public holiday
- (2) Whenever in this Ordinance a shop is exempted from the provisions of weekly half-holidays or from the provisions of closing orders, shop assistants may be employed during the times that such shops may be open subject to the provisions of paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of sub-section (1) of this section
- (3) For the purpose of stocktaking or other special emergency work that cannot be performed during the usual hours, the working hours of shop assistants may be extended on days other than Sundays or public holidays for not more than two hours in any one day

Sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

(2) In each year of continuous service from the commencement of this Ordinance under the same employer a shop assistant shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for twelve clear working days to be taken in a consecutive period. Provided that the employer may fix the time of leave for the different shop assistants with reasonable regard to the exigencies of his business.

Provided that such working hours shall not be extended on more than tour days in any one week or thirty days in any one year

Provided further that, notwithstanding anything contained in this Ordinance an occupier, having given due notice as prescribed in the next succeeding proviso shall be entitled to extend the hours of his shop assistants, not more than twice in any one year, to a Saturday afternoon followed by a Sunday and a Monday when the Monday is a public holiday, for the purposes of stocktaking, and any occupier so electing to carry out his stocktaking shall not be permitted to extend the hours of his shop assistants for stocktaking purposes on any other day or days

Provided further that every occupier so extending the hours of his shop assistants shall give reasonable notice to the officer in charge of the police station of the district in which the shop is situated of his intention so to do, specifying the dates of such extension and the names of the assistants concerned

(4) Save as is provided in the last preceding subsection no occupiei shall peimit an assistant to iemain in his shop beyond the hours prescribed for the employment of such assistant under the provisions of this section or after the closing hour prescribed under this Ordinance

Provided that an assistant may remain in a shop for a period of fifteen minutes after prescribed closing hour or beyond the hours prescribed for his employment for the purpose of serving a customer who has entered the shop before the prescribed closing hour or for the purpose of closing the shop

- (5) Any assistant found in a shop after the closing hour prescribed by this Ordinance or beyond the hours permitted for his employment under this section shall be deemed to be in the employment of such occupier until the contrary is proved "
- 3 Sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 5 of the Principal Amendment of Ordinance are hereby amended by renumbering those sub- section 5 (2) and (3) of the sections as section "54 (1)" and sub-section "(2)" respectively, Principal Ordinance and by adding a marginal note thereto as follows —

"Annual leave of absence

(3) For the purpose of this section the expression "the same employer" shall include in case of the death of an employer, the legal representative, hen or legatee of that employer, or in the case of insolvency or liquidation of the employer the receiver or liquidator, so long as such representative, heir, legatee, receiver or liquidator continues to carry on the business of that shop and to employ that shop assistant therein

Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Sunday closing

8 All shops in townships and other areas to which this Ordinance applies shall be closed for the serving of customers on Sundays Provided that where any local authority applies for exemption from Sunday closing the Governor in Council may grant such exemption either as to the whole or part of Sunday and either generally or in respect of any particular class of shops or trades

Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend -

Penalties

- 15 In the case of any contravention of or failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance the occupier of the shop shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding
 - (a) In the case of a first conviction five pounds (or in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding fourteen days),
 - (b) In the case of a second conviction ten pounds (or in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month),
 - (c) In the case of a third or subsequent conviction thirty pounds (or in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding two months)

Provided that in the case of a shop assistant employed after hours in contravention of the Ordinance the occupier shall not be guilty of an offence against the Ordinance if he proves that his shop assistant was engaged only in serving customers whom he was already serving or who were in the shop before the closing hour or that there was reasonable ground for believing that the article supplied to the customer was required in case of illness

4 Section 8 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by the deletion of the words "for the serving of section 8 of the customers" which occur in the second line thereof Principal Ordinance

5 Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by deleting the proviso which occurs at the end of the thereof

Principal Ordinance

OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is alleged in certain quarters that, although the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, provides that a shop shall not be open for serving customers after a certain hour, yet, in fact, employees are frequently kept at work in the shop long after that hour behind closed doors. The object of this Bill is to remedy this state of affairs.

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance at present provides that no shop assistant shall be employed in or about a shop for more than fifty hours including meal times in any one week or more than nine hours in any one day. In this Bill provision is made to the effect that subject to the exceptions hereafter mentioned no person shall employ any shop assistant for more than fifty hours in any one week including intervals for meals, or for more than eight hours in any one day excluding intervals for meals to be completed within nine hours from the commencement of the assistant's work, or on more than six days in any one week, or on any Sunday or public holiday It is, however, provided that shop assistants who work in shops which are exempted from weekly half-holidays or from the provisions of closing orders may be employed during the times that such shops may be open subject to the above limitation as to the number of hours in any one day, and the number of days in any one week, and as to Sundays and public holidays

Provision is also made for the extension of the working hours of shop assistants during stocktaking and other emergency work which cannot be performed during the usual hours. There is a further provision to the effect that, except in exceptional circumstances, no assistant shall be permitted to remain in a shop for more than a quarter of an hour after closing time.

Finally, as the Principal Ordinance stands at present, all shops affected by it must be closed "for the serving of customers" on Sundays—it is provided in this Bill that such shops must be physically closed on Sundays

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Public Notice of an Application which will be made for Authority to Supply Electrical Linergy outside the Area of Supply Comprised in Distributing Licence No. 9 held by the East Airican Power and Lighting Company, Limited, in respect of the Municipality of Eldoret

NOTICE is hereby given to all whom it may concern that on the 9th day of November, 1936, Messrs The East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, of Nahobi, a limited liability company incorporated in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya will make application to His Excellency the Governor in Council pursuant to section 3 of the Electric Power (Amendment) Ordinance, 1930, for authority to supply electrical energy outside the area comprised in Distributing Licence No 9 for the distribution and supply of electrical energy in the Municipality of Eldoret

The Uasin Gishu District Council is a local authority which may be affected by the grant of the application, it and in so far as it may contemplate an application for a distributing licence for any area comprising either or both of the said plots at some future date, but not otherwise

With the exception of the said Uasin Gishu District Council there is no public or local authority, company, person, or body of persons who could or might be affected by the giant of the application, so far as the applicant is aware


