BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows' and Orphans' Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Ordinance (Chapter 34 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Government Actuary who was appointed by the Secretary of State to investigate into the mortality experience of the East African European Officers' Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme has recommended that the basic rate of interest should be regarded as six per centum instead of eight per centum as hitherto

Clauses 2 and 3 —The present range of Pension Tables is inadequate in that it does not provide for benefits in respect of husbands up to the age of 54 last birthday, and in order that provision may be made for such benefits the Pension Tables A and C have been extended

Clause 4 —Revised Instructions for the use of Pension Tables have been prepared on the basis that bachelor contributions made on or after the first July 1936, will, for the purpose of the calculation and registration of a pension on marriage, be accumulated at 6 per centum, whereas bachelor contributions made prior to that date will be accumulated at 8 per centum. This Clause is designed to incorporate such instructions in the Principal Ordinance

No additional expenditure of public money will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
