GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 798

TO ALL CIVIL SERVANTS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE
COLONY AND PROTECTORATE OF KENYA:

It has been a bitter disappointment to me that during the last two months of my term of office I have been ordered by my medical advisers to refrain from active work. It had been my intention to pay flying visits to the Provinces and in Nairobi and Mombasa to visit various offices, institutions and schools with the object of saying good-bye personally. All I can do now is to express to you all my gratitude for the loyalty and devotion to duty with which you have assisted me in administering the government of this Colony during six most trying and difficult years.

It is just on 43 years since I joined His Majesty's Service; during these years I have had experience as a Regimental and Staff Officer in the Army, as Inspector General of the Royal Irish Constabulary, and as Governor of two other Colonies. Nowhere have I been assisted by more keen and willing workers.

I wish you all happiness and prosperity, and feel confident that my successor can depend upon the same loyal service which you have at all times accorded to me.
