ORDINANCES (No 6)

Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Instruments not duly stamped inadmissible in evidence, etc No instrument chargeable with duty shall be admitted in evidence for any purpose by any person having by law or consent of parties authority to receive evidence or shall be acted upon, registered or authenticated by any such person or by any public officer, unless such instrument is duly stamped

Provided that—

- (a) Any such instrument not being an instrument chargeable with duty of ten cents or twenty cents only, or a bill of exchange or promissory note, shall, subject to all just exceptions, be admitted in evidence on payment of the duty with which the same is chargeable, or, in the case of an instrument insufficiently stamped, of the amount required to make up such duty, together with a penalty of one pound, or, when ten times the amount of the proper duty or deficient portion thereof exceeds one pound, of a sum equal to ten times such duty or portion,
- (b) Where any person from whom a stamped receipt could have been demanded, has given an unstamped receipt and such receipt if stamped would be admissible in evidence against him, then such receipt shall be admitted in evidence against him on payment of a penalty of two shillings by the person tendering it,
- (c) Where a contract or agreement of any kind is effected by correspondence consisting of two or more letters

A Bill to Amend the Stamp Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Stamp (Amend-Short title ment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Ordinance (Chapter 57 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following paragraph to the section 37 proviso thereto -

Amendment of of the Principal

"(f) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary here-Ordinance in contained a bill of exchange (including a cheque) which is presented for acceptance, or accepted, or payable outside the Colony shall not be invalid by reason only that it is not stamped in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, and any such bill of exchange which is unstamped or not properly stamped may be received in evidence on payment of the proper duty and penalties prescribed under paragraph (a) of this section "

and any one of the letters bears the proper stamp, the contract or agreement shall be deemed to be duly stamped,

- (d) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the admission of any instrument in evidence in any proceeding in a criminal court,
- (e) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the admission of any instrument in any court when such instrument has been executed by or on behalf of the Government, or where it bears the certificate of a revenue authority as provided by section thirty-four or any other provision of this Ordinance

3 (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Ordin- Exemption ance contained, no power, warrant or letter of attorney bank granted or to be granted by the Postmaster General, nor any power, warrant or letter of attorney given by any depositor in duty the savings bank to any other person, authorizing him to make any deposit of any sum of money in the savings bank on behalf of the said depositor or to sign any document or instrument required by the rules or regulations of the savings bank to be signed on making such deposit or to receive back any sum of money deposited in the savings bank, or the interest arising therefrom, nor any receipt nor any entry in any book of receipts for money deposited in the savings bank, not for any money received by any depositor, his executors or administrators, assigns, attorneys or agent's, from the funds thereof, nor any draft or order, nor any appointment of any agent, nor any certificate, or other instrument or document whatsoever required or authorized to be given, issued, signed, made or produced in pursuance of the Savings Bank Ordinance, 1936, or No 29 of 1936 of any Rules made thereunder, or of any Ordinance amending or replacing the same, shall be subject to, or be charged with any stamp duty or duties whatsoever

(2) The term "savings bank" in this section contained means the Savings Bink established under the provisions of the Savings Bank Ordinance, 1936, or any Ordinance amending No 29 of 1936. or replacing the same

(3) This section shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of January, 1937

Principal Ordinance

"(a) Power of Attorney exempted under section twentythree of the East Africa Post Office Savings Bank Ordinance, 1909, or any Ordinance amending or in substitution for the same "

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Clause 2—At International Conventions which were held at Geneva on the 7th June, 1930, and 19th March, 1931, it was agreed that the validity of obligations arising out of (a) a cheque, and (b) a bill of exchange or promissory note, or the exercise of the rights that flow therefrom, should not be subordinated to the observance of the provisions concerning the stamp. The ratification and accession of these Conventions by His Majesty's Government, in respect of the United Kingdom, do not include any Colony or Protectorate, and by an Article in each Convention a notification may be made to the Secretary General of the League of Nations that it is desired that the Convention shall apply to any Colony and Protectorate, the resultant application taking effect in the Colony ninety days after the receipt of such notification

It was further agreed that if the laws of a High Contracting I arty did not already make provision to that effect, such laws should be altered

A reservation was however made by the United Kingdom representative at the time the 1931 Convention was drawn up that the only instruments to which the provisions of that Convention should apply were the Bills of Exchange presented for acceptance or accepted or payable elsewhere than in the United Kingdom. The reservation admits of a similar limitation applying in the case of any British Dependency

After consulting the various local bodies who are interested in this matter, it has been decided that both these Conventions should be applied to Kenya, with the same reservation, in the case of the Convention relating to Bills of Exchange as is risde by the United Kingdom and the Secretary of State has been informed accordingly

Clause 2 is designed to make the necessary alteration to Kenva law by following closely the provisions of section 42 of the Finance Act, 1933 (of England)

Clauses 3 and 4 — The new Savings Bank Ordinance, 1936, which comes into operation on the 1st day of January, 1937, contains no provision for the exemption of instruments used in connection with the Savings Bank from stamp duty as was the case with the old Savings Bank Ordinance (Chapter 95) which was recently repealed. It is proposed to make provision for this exemption in the Stamp Ordinance

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law, and, as the effect of Clause 3 will be merely to continue the existing practice, no additional loss of public revenue will result therefrom

Present Financial Position of the Colony, and the Position Anticipated in 1937.

With a view to the removal of certain misapirehensions which appear to be current, the following particulars in regard to the financial position of the Colony are published for general information

It will be realized that as estimates have to be prepared considerably Difficulties of in advance of the period to which they refer, it is impossible for them to estimation reflect in full either the improvement or the deterioration in the economic situation During a period of diminishing trade and prosperity the balance of revenue and expenditure will consequently tend to compare unfavourably with the estimates, and conversely in a period of increasing trade and rising prosperity, the year's surplus will tend to exceed the Estimate

4 If the surplus now anticipated in 1933 is realized the Colony's surplus Surplus balances at the end of the year will stand at a figure in the neighbourhood of balances £340,000, but of this sum the greater portion is immobilized

The draft Estimates for 1937 which will be laid on the table of the Diatt Legislative Council will show a net increase in expenditure of some £50,000 1937 and a decrease in Revenue of £47,000 consequent on the abolition of the levy on official salaries Against this adverse balance of approximately £100,000 a sum of £57,000 is estimated to accive from increased Customs revenue Even if, on the existing basis of taxation, full account is taken of increases in other directions the Budget will not balance. On the other hand if Sir Alan

Pim's proposals in regard to Non-Native taxation are approved, a surplus can be shown. The additional Revenue will be obtained to a very large extent from absentee shure-holders and others who in there have not contributed towards the revenue of the Colony.

Deferred commitments

In order fully to appreciate the financial position of the Colony at the present juncture, it is ust be realized that owing to the budget difficulties experienced during the years of depression it has been necessary temporarily to postpone the discharge of certain specific habilities. For instance, Loan Sinking Fund payments have been reduced to the statutory minimum of one per cent, contributions to the Water Works Renewal Fund have ceased and the arrears due by Government to the European and Asian Civil Service Provident Funds have been charged to a Suspense Account instead of to expenditure direct. In addition, provision for the maintenance of and repairs to public buildings and works has been reduced to a level quite inadequate to maintain these assets at a proper standard. It is thus evident that even if continued economic improvement cruses the surplus of revenue over expenditure to exceed the estimate, that surplus should first be applied to the discharge of habilities with which the Colony is faced.
