#### THE HARBOURS REGULATION ORDINANCE, 1928

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 49 of the Harbours Regulation Ordinance, 1928, the High Commissioner for Transport has made the following Regulations:—

Short title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Harbours (Amendment) Regulations, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Harbours Regulations, 1928, and any amendment thereto hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

Revocation and substitution of Principal Regulation 25.

- 2. Regulation 25 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—
  - "25. (a) The master or agent of any ship shall, not later than 24 hours after the ship's arrival in a harbour, deliver to the Port Management a true copy in duplicate of the manifest or report of cargo inwards, giving detailed weights or measurements as utilized for sea freight purposes. The master or agent shall also similarly furnish a manifest in duplicate of the cargo shipped and/or transhipped to such ship not later than 24 hours after her departure.
  - (b) The master or agent of any ship shall not later than 24 hours after the ship's arrival in a harbour, deliver to the Port Management a true list in duplicate of lifts over 3 tons comprised in her import cargo for that harbour."

3. Regulation 106 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

(a) Importers or persons in charge of goods shall deliver at the appointed place during the regular working hours of any harbour as specified in the Tariff of Harbour Dues and Charges, Declaration and Disposal Orders complete in every detail and respect and specify the respective marks and numbers on packages, or articles in respect of unpacked goods, their number, description and contents with the dead weight, cubic measurement and value thereof, also the name of the ship and the port the goods are from and, in the case of cargo for transhipment, the port the goods are intended for. In cases where rail delivery is required, consignment notes, complete in every respect shall accompany the relative Declaration and Disposal Order. There shall be a separate Declaration and Disposal Order for each separate consignee.
- (b) Persons desiring goods to be shipped shall deliver to the appointed place during the regular working hours of any harbour as specified in the Tariff of Harbour Dues and Charges shipping orders, complete in every detail and respect and specifying the respective marks and numbers on packages or articles in respect of unpacked goods, their number, description and contents with the deadweight or cubic measurement or value thereof as required by the Tariff or Harbour Dues and Charges, also the name of the ship and the port the goods are intended for. There shall be a separate shipping order for each consignment."

Revocation and substitution of Principal Regulation 106.

Regulation 110 of the Principal Regulations is hereby Amendment amended by the revocation of paragraph (a) thereof and the Regulation substitution therefor of the following:—

"110. (a) When the weight or cubic measurement is not available, the goods will be weighed or measured by the Port Management which will call upon the person presenting the Declaration and Disposal Order or Shipping Order to pay the prescribed charges."

5. These Regulations shall come into force on the first Date of day of February, 1937.
