SUPPLEMENTS

Kenya Proclamations, Rules and Regulations (No. 2)

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to repeal:—

3. No pensionable servant of State railways can become a depositor in the provident fund.

Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Interpretation.

- 4. In this Ordinance or any rules made hereunder unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context:—
 - (a) "State railway" means a State railway open to public traffic and shall be deemed to include the Kenya and Uganda Railway.
 - (b) "Manager" means the manager or other chief officer of a State railway.
 - (c) "Servant" means a Government servant serving on the non-pensionable establishment of a State railway, and who under the rules of the fund is eligible to become a depositor.
 - (d) "Depositor" means a servant by and on whose behalf a deposit is made under this Ordinance.
 - (e) "Deposit" means a deposit in the provident fund and may be either:—
 - "Compulsory deposit," i.e., a deposit which a servant is under the rule obliged to make; or
 - "Voluntary deposit," i.e., a deposit which it is optional to a servant to make or not.
 - (f) "Interest" includes compound interest.
 - (g) "Bonus" means a bonus added by Government to a deposit under the rules with the interest accruing thereon.

A Bill to Amend the State Railway Provident Fund Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- This Ordinance may be cited as the State Railway Short title. Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the State Railway Provident Fund Ordinance (Chapter 35 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred Cap., 35 to as the Principal Ordinance.
- 2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal of Section 3 of repealed. the Principal Ordinance.
- 3. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment amended by deleting therefrom paragraph (c) thereof and sub- of Section 4 of stituting therefor the following:—

the Principal Ordinance.

" (c) 'Servant' means a servant as defined by the Rules of the Fund."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Under the existing law no servant of the High Commissioner for Transport who is on the pensionable staff of the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours Administration is eligible to become a depositor in the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours Provident Fund. He is thereby precluded from making voluntary deposits to the Fund. It is the policy of the Railway Administration to encourage thrift in all members of its staff, and, to enable this to be carried out to the fullest extent, it is proposed to open the Provident Fund to pensionable as well as other servants within the limits allowed by the Rules.

Before this object can be achieved it is necessary to amend the State Railway Provident Fund Ordinance, and this Bill makes the necessary provision.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

OXFORD UNIVERSITY SUMMER SCHOOL ON COLONIAL ADMINISTRATION SAINT HUGH'S COLLEGE

3—17 July, 1937

Chairman: Professor Coupland, c.i.e. Vice-Chairman: Miss Margery Perham

This School is being organized under the auspices of the Social Studies Research Committee of Oxford University. It is intended primarily for the benefit of officers of the Colonial Administrative Service, and mainly for those serving in Africa. It is hoped that Administrative Officers of the Sudan Civil Service will also attend. The lectures will, however, be of sufficiently wide range to interest officers in other than the Administrative Service and serving elsewhere than in Africa, and these will be welcomed as members of the School.

The main subject of the School will be Colonial, or, more specifically, Native administration. Attention will not, however, be concentrated narrowly upon this theme: rather an attempt will be made to present the administrative problems of Tropical Africa in a wide general and comparative setting. One course of lectures will therefore treat certain recent developements in the world as a whole, economic and political, national and international. A second course, approaching the subject more nearly, will demonstrate the experience of other countries in certain directions that are of interest to Africa. Among these will be local government, elementary and adult education, and co-operative societies. A third course, in which leading foreign experts will lecture, will deal directly with the main subject and will give a comparative survey of native administration in territories other than British Africa. Finally lectures and discussions about native administration in Africa, in different regions and aspects, will be arranged. The help of some of the anthropologists will be obtained for these talks, in which the active assistance of members of the course will be invited. It is thought that, in addition to the more formal proceedings, members may welcome the opportunity of making contact with those from other territories or other branches of the Service. They will also be able to obtain from the lecturers advice as to further study in the subjects in which they are The Rhodes House Library will be available for members of the School.

The School will be opened by the Right Hon. W. G. A. Ormsby-Gore, M.P., Secretary of State for the Colonies.

The inaugural address will be given by the Right Hon. LORD LUGARD.
