THE SISAL INDUSTRY ORDINANCE, 1934

NOTICE.

It is notified for general information that with effect from the 1st March, 1937, the following standard of grading has been prescribed by the Sisal Industry Committee. This standard of grading is liable to alteration from time to time by the Sisal Industry Committee. The particulars of such alterations will be published in the Official Gazette and also transmitted by letter to holders of Grading Certificates.

STANDARD OF GRADING.

(i) Grades with which a sisal grower must conform in order to obtain a Certificate of Grading which entitles him to use the E.A. Sisal Association mark on bales of sisal fibre so graded are as follows:—

Sisal.

1. Length from a minimum of 3 feet upwards and with an average of 3′ 6″. Free of defective decortication. Properly brushed. Free of tow and bunchy ends and harshness.

Colour—creamy white to cream.

A. Length from a minimum of 3 feet upwards and with an average of 3′ 6″. Free of defective decortication. Properly brushed. Free of tow and bunchy ends and harshness.

Colour—yellowish, sunburned, slightly spotted, or slightly discoloured.

2. Length from a minimum of 2' 6" upwards. Free of defective decortication. Properly brushed. Free of tow and bunchy ends and harshness.

Colour—creamy white to cream.

B. Length from a minimum of 2' 6" upwards. Free of defective decortication. Properly brushed. Free of tow and bunchy ends and harshness.

Colour—yellowish, sunburned, slightly spotted or slightly discoloured.

- Note.—The word 'harshness' included in the definitions of No. 1, A, 2, and B grades only refers to fibre from which the gum has not been sufficiently extracted by cleaning and does not apply to fibre which is coarse in texture, due to soil or climatic conditions.
- (ii) Grades with which a sisal grower need not conform in order to obtain a Certificate of Grading, are as follows:—
 - 3. Brushed fibre that does not conform to grades 1, A, 2 and B. Although minor defects are allowable, it must be free of barky or undecorticated fibre.

Tow.

1. Proper tow. Free of hemp and cuttings and reasonably free of dust and dirt.

Colour—creamy white to cream.

- 2. Deeper cream colour allowed, also small percentage of hemp and long white cuttings. (This grade may be described simply as "Tow" on labels.)
- Note.—A holder of a Certificate who conforms with grades Sisal 3, and Tow 1 and 2, will be entitled to use the E.A. Sisal Association mark on bales of sisal fibre so graded; if he does not conform, he must not use the mark for his equivalent to these grades.

Use of Sisal Grading Mark.

Any sisal grower who grades sisal fibre produced by him in accordance with the foregoing standard, may use the following mark—



on any sisal fibre produced by him, provided that such fibre conforms to the standard of grading prescribed by the Sisal Industry Committee, and provided he has been granted a Certificate to that effect by the Sisal Industry Committee, to whom application should be made.



THE FOREIGN ENLISTMENT ACT, 1870.

Notice.

THE attention of the public is drawn to the fact that the provisions of the Foreign Enlistment Act are applicable in the case of the present conflict in Spain.

This Act declares inter alia that it is an offence—

- (1) for any British subject or British protected person to accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military, naval or air services of either party to the present conflict, or for any person within the Colony and Protectorate to induce any other person to accept or agree to accept any such commission or engagement;
- (2) for any British subject or British protected person to leave or attempt to leave the Colony with the intention of accepting any such commission or engagement and for any person in the Colony to induce any other person to do so; and
- (3) for any person, being the master or owner of any vessel, knowingly either to take on board, or engage to take on board, or have on board such vessel, any illegally enlisted person.

Any person contravening these provisions is liable on conviction to imprisonment up to two years or to fine or to both fine and imprisonment

- 6. The balance of the purchase money and the rent due to the 31st December, 1937, shall be paid to the District Commissioner, Nairobi, within seven days of the sale.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the period stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant of the plot duly executed.

And further provided that, if the purchaser of Plot No. 2463/1, 2463/2, 2463/3, 2463/4 or 2464, so elects, the balance of purchase money may be paid in three equal annual instalments, subject to interest at the rate of 5 per centum per annum on the outstanding balance, the first of such instalments to be paid, together with the interest that shall have accrued due, on the 1st January, 1938, and thereafter instalments and interest to be paid on the 1st January in each year.
