Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Lights on
carriages.

31. Every driver or person in charge of a motor vehicle or carriage on a road between the hours of 6.15 p.m. and 5.45 a.m. shall provide and maintain such motor vehicle or carriage with a lamp or lamps in proper working order to be fixed or carried and lighted in such manner as may be prescribed by Rules made under section 49 of this Ordinance.

A Bill to Amend the Traffic Ordinance, 1928.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 26 of 1928.

2. Section 31 of the Principal Ordinance as amended by the Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

Repeal and replacement of section 31 of the Principal Ordinance.

No. 41 of 1934.

“31. Every driver or person in charge of a motor vehicle or carriage on a road shall provide and maintain such motor vehicle or carriage with a lamp or lamps in proper working order to be fixed or carried and lighted in such manner and during such hours as may be prescribed by rules made under this Ordinance.”

Lights on carriages.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This amendment is necessitated by the introduction of uniform time which came into operation on the 1st of January, 1937.

As lighting-up time may be, and is, prescribed by rules under the Principal Ordinance, it is proposed to amend section 31 by deleting therefrom any reference to the hours.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Time and
procedure for

Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

3. (1) A claim for obtaining repayment under section 2 of this Ordinance shall be made four times annually in respect of imported kerosene oil used in the three months ending 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December respectively.

(2) For the purpose of making such claim the user of imported kerosene oil shall make and subscribe a statutory declaration in the form in the schedule hereto before a magistrate, a justice of the peace or a commissioner for oaths.

(3) Such claim shall thereupon be sent by the user to the Treasurer not later than one month after the expiry of the three months in respect of which the claim is made, and the Treasurer shall pay to the user, out of such funds as may be provided by the Legislative Council for that purpose, such sum as may be due under the provisions of this Ordinance.

**A Bill to Amend the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of
Duty) Ordinance, 1930**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of Duty) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Kerosene Oil (Repayment of Duty) Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 58 of 1930.

2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

(a) by deleting therefrom sub-section (2) thereof and substituting therefor the following sub-section—

“(2) For the purpose of making such claim the user of imported kerosene oil shall submit a certificate, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, to the Treasurer not later than one month after the expiration of the three months in respect of which the claim is made, and the Treasurer shall pay to the user, out of such funds as may be provided by the Legislative Council for that purpose, such sum as may be due under the provisions of this Ordinance.”;

and

(b) by deleting therefrom sub-section (3) thereof and substituting therefor the following sub-section—

“(3) Any person who knowingly makes any false statement or entry in a certificate submitted to the Treasurer under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction for a first offence to a fine of fifty pounds or to

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the Principal Ordinance a person making a claim for obtaining repayment of Customs duty paid on kerosene oil used solely for agricultural purposes must subscribe a statutory declaration before a magistrate, a justice of the peace, or a commissioner for oaths.

It has been represented that in order to make such declarations farmers in outlying districts have to travel long distances at considerable cost to themselves.

The object of this Bill is to substitute a certificate for the formal statutory declaration and to provide penalties for knowingly submitting a false certificate.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law, but there will be a small loss of revenue of approximately £80 per annum in respect of attestation fees.
