A Bill to Amend the Trustee Ordinance, 1929

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Trustee (Amend- short title.) ment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Trustee Ordinance, 1929, hereinafter referred to as the No. 28 of 1929. Principal Ordinance.
- 2. Sub-section (4) of section 26 of the Principal Ordin- Amendment of ance is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor:—

section 26 (4) of the **Principal** Ordinance.

"(4) The power of attorney shall be attested by at least one witness and shall be registered under the Crown Cap. 140 Lands Ordinance or the Registration of Titles Ordinance Cap. 142. within thirty days of execution, if executed in the Colony, or within thirty days of first arrival in the Colony, if executed out of the Colony, with a statutory declaration by the donor that he intends to remain out of the Colony for a period exceeding one month from the date of such declaration, or from a date therein mentioned."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

In some cases where powers of attorney are given by trustees out of the Colony it is impossible to comply with the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 26 of the Trustee Ordinance, 1929, because the time for registration is restricted to ten days.

The object of this Bill is to increase that period by providing that powers of attorney executed in the Colony shall be registered within thirty days and those executed out of the Colony within thirty days of first arrival in the Colony.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.


