Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Eldoret, for necessary action.
- 3. The term of the grants will be 25 years from the 1st June, 1937.

The term of the grants will be extendable to 99 years if at any time during the term of the grant a main building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations, be erected on the plot.

Grants will be subject to the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142).
