A Bill to Amend the Tribal Police Ordinance, 1929

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tribal Police Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Tribal Police Ordinance, 1929, hereinafter referred to as No. 10 of 1929. the Principal Ordinance.
- The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the Amendment of addition of the following new section 21 immediately after section 20 thereof:—

the Principal Ordinance.

"21. The Governor in Council may make regulations Power to make for the granting and payment of gratuities to tribal police officers.

regulations for the granting and payment of gratuities.

All such gratuities shall be charged upon and paid out of the Revenues of the Colony."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Tribal Police Ordinance, 1929, in order that regulations may be made for the granting and payment of gratuities to tribal police officers. The expenditure of public moneys involved if the provisions of this Bill become law will amount to approximately £120 per annum.

A Bill to Amend the Law of Evidence with Respect to Bankers' Books

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Evidence (Bankers' Books) Ordinance, 1937.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance the expression—

"bank" or "banker" means any company, person or body of persons, whether incorporated or not, engaged in the business of banking within the Colony and includes the Savings Bank established under the provisions of the Savings Bank No. 29 of 1936. Ordinance, 1936, or any branch thereof;

"banker's book" includes ledgers, day books, cash books, account books and all other books used in the ordinary business of the bank;

"court" means the court, judge, arbitrator or person or persons before whom a legal proceeding is held or taken;

"legal proceeding" means any civil or criminal proceeding or inquiry in which evidence is or may be given, and includes an arbitration.

Mode of proof of entries in banker's books.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, a copy of any entry in a banker's book shall in all legal proceedings be received as prima facie evidence of such entry, and of the matters, transactions, and accounts therein recorded.

Proof that book is a banker's book.

4. A copy of an entry in a banker's book shall not be received in evidence under this Ordinance unless it be first proved that the book was at the time of the making of the entry one of the ordinary books of the bank, and that the entry was made in the usual and ordinary course of business, and that the book is in the custody or control of the bank.

Such proof may be given by a partner or officer of the bank, and may be given orally or by an affidavit sworn before

any commissioner for oaths or persons authorized to take affidavits.

5. A copy of an entry in a banker's book shall not be Verification received in evidence under this Ordinance unless it be further of copy. proved that the copy has been examined with the original entry and is correct.

Such proof shall be given by some person who has examined the copy with the original entry, and may be given either orally or by an affidavit sworn before any commissioner for oaths or person authorized to take affidavits.

6. A banker or officer of a bank shall not, in any legal Case in which proceedings to which the bank is not a party, be compellable to produce any banker's book the contents of which can be produce book, proved under this Ordinance, or to appear as a witness to prove the matters, transactions, and accounts therein recorded, unless by order of a judge made for special cause.

7. On the application of any party to a legal proceed. Court may ing a court may order that such party be at liberty to inspect order inspection, etc. and take copies of any entries in a banker's book for any of the purposes of such proceedings. An order under this section may be made either with or without summoning the bank or any other party, and shall be served on the bank three clear days before the same is to be obeyed, unless the court otherwise directs.

8. The costs of any application to a court under or for Costs. the purposes of this Ordinance, and the costs of anything done or to be done under an order of a court made under or for the purposes of this Ordinance shall be in the discretion of the court which may order the same or any part thereof to be paid to any party by the bank where the same have been occasioned by any default or delay on the part of the bank. Any such order against a bank may be enforced as if the bank was a party to the proceeding.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

There is considerable doubt as to whether the Bankers' Book Evidence Act, 1879, applies to Kenya, and it is considered desirable to remove such doubt by enacting specific legislation.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Sub-section (2) of section 30 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend:—

Certain conditions in policies to be of no effect.

(2) Any condition in a policy issued for the purposes of the preceding sub-section providing that no liability shall arise under the policy, or that any liability arising shall cease in the event of some specified thing being done or omitted to be done after the happening of the event giving rise to a claim under the policy, shall be of no effect in connexion with such claims as are mentioned in the preceding sub-section:

Provided further that such a policy shall not be required to cover liability in respect of injury to the property of any person caused by or arising out of the use of the vehicle on a road in excess of a sum of one thousand pounds in respect of any one claim or number of claims arising out of any one event:

And provided further that nothing in this section shall be taken to render void any provision in a policy requiring the person insured to repay to the insurer any sums which the latter may have become liable to pay under the policy and which have been applied to the satisfaction of the claims of third parties.

A Bill to Amend the Traffic Ordinance, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Traffic (Amend-Short title. ment No. 2) Ordinance, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Traffic Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the No. 26 of 1928. Principal Ordinance.
- 2. Section 30 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

Amendment of Section 30 of the Principal Ordinance.

- (a) by deleting therefrom the comma which appears after the word "policy" in the third line of sub-section (2) thereof; and
- (b) by inserting therein a comma between the word "subsection" and the word "providing" which appear in the second line of the said sub-section and between the word "cease" and the word "in" which appear in the fourth line of the said sub-section.

The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by in- Amendment of serting therein, immediately after section 31 thereof, the follow- Ordinance. ing new section:—

"31A. No person shall ride any pedal bicycle on any Rear reflectors road in the Colony unless such bicycle has affixed to the rear mudguard a red reflector disc of such a nature and so fitted as to be clearly visible to drivers or vehicles overtaking such bicycle.

This section shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint."

"48A. (1) The owner of any vehicle shall, within Owner to seven days after receiving a request in that behalf, furnish name to a licensing officer or to a police officer of or above the person driving rank of assistant inspector, the name and address of the vehicle at any person who was driving such motor vehicle at any particular time when an offence, under this Ordinance or under any other law for the time being in force, is alleged to have been committed.

Any owner who fails to comply with a request made under the provisions of this sub-section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(2) Where the name and address of the person so furnished is that of the owner of the vehicle then, notwithstanding the provisions of sections 25 and 26 of the Indian Evidence Act, as applied to the Colony, such information, although furnished by the owner of the vehicle to a police officer, shall be admissible in evidence in any proceedings instituted against such owner in respect of the alleged offence."

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of the Bill is to amend the Traffic Ordinance in the following respects:—

Clause 2 is designed to remove an ambiguity created by the incorrect punctuation of section 30 (2) of the Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1930, and is being made at the request of the Accident Insurance Association of Eastern Africa.

Clause 3 provides that every bicycle used in the Colony shall be fitted with a proper rear reflector.

Clause 4.—It may happen that a driver of a vehicle in respect of which an offence is alleged to have been committed cannot be identified, and it is proposed to amend the law so as to make it obligatory upon the owner to furnish the name and address of the person who was driving the vehicle at the particular time.

Sub-section (2) of the new Clause is a necessary corollary to sub-clause (1) thereof inasmuch as, if the unidentified driver of the vehicle is in fact the owner, the statement that he was driving the vehicle at the material time might amount to a confession and thus be inadmissible under the Indian Evidence Act in proceedings brought against him in respect of the alleged offence.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.
