A Bill to Amend the Public Trustee's Ordinance, 1925

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Trustee's Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Public Trustee's Ordinance, 1925, hereinafter referred to No 7 of 1925 as the Principal Ordinance

2 (1) The Attorney General, and the Treasurer, of the Appointment of Colony are hereby appointed Commissioners for the purpose of advising the Public Trustee as to the investment of trust funds, and the disposal of such investments, administered by hım

(2) No trust funds shall be invested, and no investments shall be disposed of, by the Public Trustee save with the consent of the Commissioners appointed under sub-section (1) of this section

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Repeal of 3 repealed

affidavit that the case is within the provisions of this Ordinance, make such order upon the petition of the Public Trustee accordingly, which order, when made, shall give to the Public Trustee the same power over all the estate wheresoever situate or left of the deceased person, except as hereby enacted, as he would have had, if letters of administration of such estate had been granted to him, subject nevertheless to any orders which may from time to time be made by the Court on petition as hereinafter mentioned touching the same or the administration thereof

Provided always that the Court may order such further notice as it may think fit to be given before making such order and provided further that it shall not be necessary for the Public Trustee to serve such notice as is in this section mentioned in any case where the Public Trustee shall have obtained the consent in writing of the executors (if any) or of all parties interested in the estate (other than creditors), as the case may be, to make such application to the Court as in this section is provided for, subject however and without prejudice to the right of the Public Trustee to take possession of and administer any estate consisting solely of property not exceeding Sh 2,000 as hereinbefore provided

Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Grant to Public Trustee may be revoked and grant made to other person

7 (1) At any time after a grant of letters of administration to the Public Trustee under this Ordinance, any person to whom the Court might have committed administration if no such grant had been made may apply to the Court for revocation of such grant and for a grant to himself of probate of the will or letters of administration, but no such application shall be made until seven days after notice in writing of intention to make it shall have been given to the Public Trustee

Upon such application the Court, after hearing the Public Trustee if he appears, may revoke the grant to the Public Trustee and grant probate or letters of administration to the applicant subject to such limitations and conditions as the Court may think fit

Provided that letters of administration granted to the Public Trustee shall not be revoked as aforesaid unless such application be made within six months after the grant to the **4** Sub-section (3) of section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word "section 7 of the "second" which appears in the third line thereof

.

Public Trustee and the Court is satisfied that there has been no unreasonable delay in making the application, or in transmitting the authority under which the application is made

(2) Upon such revocation and new grant, all the interest, powers, rights and duties of the Public Trustee in regard to the estate affected by such grant, and all liabilities of the Public Trustee under any contract or agreement entered into by him in relation to such estate or any part thereof, shall cease, and such portion of the estate as shall be left unadminis ered by the Public Trustee shall vest in the person obtaining such new grant, subject nevertheless to all lawful contracts theretofore made relating to such estate and to the allowance and payment of all outlays, disbursements, costs, fees, charges and expenses reasonably incurred in the administration thereof

(3) The provisions of this section shall apply in the case of an estate of which the Public Trustee has taken possession under the second proviso to section 4 in like manner as if there had been a grant of letters of administration to the Public Trustee on the date upon which he took possession

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OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of Clause 2 of this Bill is to appoint the Attorney General and the Treasurer as Commissioners to advise the Public Trustee on the investment of trust funds

Clause 3 repeals section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which was replaced by section 4 of the Public Trustee's (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937

Clause 4 corrects a typographical error

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

The right to withdraw the plot from the auction is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands

In the following General and Special Conditions of Sale, the term "Authority" means the District Commissioner, Kitale, or such other Municipal Authority as may be hereafter established by law

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) Auction

1 The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bidding shall be retracted

2 The highest bidder will be the purchaser, but if any dispute arise as to any bid, the plot will be reoffered at the last undisputed bid

3 The purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25 per cent of the purchase money In default of such payment, the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused

4 The purchaser shall on paying the deposit inform the auctioneer of the name or names of the person or persons on whose behalf the plot is purchased, the grant will be issued in accordance with this information

5 The balance of the purchase money, together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1938, shall be paid to the Provincial Commissioner, Nakuru

The survey fees (Sh 70), the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the giant (Sh 120) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent on the purchase place and on the rent), and all other expenses, if any, shall be paid to the Director of Surveys, Nairobi

All these amounts shall be paid within seven days of a demand being made therefor

(b) General

1 The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose, shall have the right to enter upon the plot, and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

2 No building shall be erected on the plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the authority, and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Kitale, for necessary action

3 The grant will be made under the Crown Lanos Ordinance (Cap 140) and the title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 142 of the Revised Edition) The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st March, 1938

4 The grantee may at any time during the currency of the grant redeem up to three-quarters of the rent of the plot on the basis of twenty years purchase

5 The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion of the plot without the previous written consent of the Governor

6 Any building erected shall conform to a building line decided upon by the authority

(c) Special

1 The plot and the buildings erected chall be used for business purposes only and at no time during the term of the grant shall any building erected on the plot be used for residential purposes
