### A Bill to Provide for the Total or Partial Cessation of Lighting in the Colony by Regulation of the Governor in Council on Occasions of Emergency or Public Danger or by way of Experiment or Practice for such Occasions

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- This Ordinance may be cited as the Lighting Control short title Ordinance, 1938
- On any occasion which the Governor in Council Power to make may consider to be an occasion of emergency or public danger, and also whenever he may consider it necessary by way of experiment or practice for any such occasion, the Governor in Council may make such regulations as he may consider desirable providing, either by express command or by request for co-operation, for the total or partial cessation of lighting in the Colony

from liability of persons regulations

Compliance with any such express command or with Exoneration any such request for co-operation shall exonerate any person from any liability contractual or otherwise for damage resulting complying with from such compliance, provided that such person has taken all other reasonable measures possible to avoid such damage

refusal or failure to

Any person who refuses or fails to comply with any Penalty for such express command shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a comply with period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and such mandatory imprisonment

### OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to enable the Governor in Council to make Regulations providing for the total or partial cessation of lighting in the Colony on occasions of emergency or public danger, or by way of experiment or practice for such occasions

The Bill is modelled on similar legislation in force in other Colonies

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

THIS School, which was organized for the first time in 1937 under the auspices of the Social Studies Research Committee of the University, will be held again in 1938 It is not proposed to repeat it until 1940 or 1941 Owing to the arrangements for leave in most of the Colonial territories, it is expected that an entirely new set of officers will attend this year. The lectures will therefore be arranged upon much the same plan which seemed to give general satisfaction in 1937.

The subject of the School will be Colonial or, more specifically, Native Administration—It has been chosen primarily for the benefit of Administrative Officers serving in the Colonial territories and in the Sudan—It offers, however, a wide common ground between these officers and those of the Departments, and it is hoped that many of the latter will attend

An attempt will be made to present the subject against the general setting of recent political and economic developments in the world as a whole Comparative light will be thrown upon the subject by lectures dealing with some of the main types of native administration, both within and without the British Empire Finally, lectures and discussions about the various problems of native administration will be arranged In this part of the Course the help of some of the anthropologists will be invited It is hoped that members of the School will play the leading part in the discussions, in which attention will be mainly directed upon the problems of tropical Africa It is thought that, in addition to the more formal proceedings, members may welcome the opportunity of making contact with those from other territories and other branches of the Service They will also obtain from the lecturers advice as to further study in the subjects in which they are interested

The School will be opened by the Right Hon W G A Ormsby-Gore, MP, Secretary of State for the Colonies

The Inaugural Address will be given by the Right Hon Lord Lugard

The lectures will again be given by leading authorities upon the various subjects

No further syllabus will be issued The time-table will be given out at the opening of the School Lectures will be given in the mornings and alternately before and after dinner on each day, except on Sunday, 3rd July, when there will be only one lecture after dinner Members are asked to arrive upon Monday, 27th June, not earlier than 2 30 or later than 7 30 p m, when dinner will be served, after which the Inaugural Address will be given

The programme will allow time for reading, games, and other activities Boating and bathing can be obtained close to the College, which stands beside the River Cherwell Tennis courts will be provided, and cricket matches arranged

Garage accommodation is not available at the College and members must make their own arrangements Brewer's Garage, Norham Mews, is close to the College

The College is about a mile from the centre of the City, and five minutes' walk from the omnibus route on the Banbury Road

### **APPLICATIONS**

The space is limited and precedence must be given to officers on the active list of the Colonial and Sudan Services. The School is open to women in the Educational and other Services, and also to the wives of officers. Applications from missionaries, unofficial residents in the Colonial territories, and retired officials will be considered after 1st May. Applications for membership should be made as long as possible in advance. They should be accompanied by a booking fee of Sh 3 (which is non-returnable) and brief particulars as to the official or other position of the applicant

The College charge for twelve days' residence is £6 12 inclusive of tips. The School fee is £2 10 Both these must be paid to 'he Secretary's Office before 1 p m on 30th June
