

A Bill to Amend the Agricultural Advances Ordinance, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Agricultural Short title Advances (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Agricultural Advances Ordinance, 1930, here- No 12 of 1930 inafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Subsection (3) of section 7 of the Principal Ordinance Amendment of is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following section 7 of the proviso-

Principal Ordinance

"Provided further that, with effect from the first day of January, 1938, no further interest shall be charged on advances made before that date and no interest shall be charged on advances made after that date"

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Principal Ordinance was enacted in 1930 as an emergency measure to meet the more pressing needs of farmers who had exhausted all existing sources of credit and whom it was desirable in the interests of the Colony to maintain on the land

The position of participants in the scheme became, however, still more depressed owing to the long duration of the recession in prices of primary products, aggravated by droughts and locust infestations, and many participants are now faced with unduly large arrears of interest

It is therefore proposed to cease charging interest on advances as from the 1st January, 1938, with a view to accelerating the winding up of the scheme and to achieving as soon as possible the original aim of the Ordinance

The immediate financial effect, if this measure becomes law, will be a loss of net revenue of approximately £3,000 in 1938, to which must be added the cost of administration, estimated at £650

These sums will both diminish annually with the winding up of the scheme

The real effect will be that moneys received in the future will be applied to repayment of capital including arrears of interest and it is not anticipated that the ultimate financial effect of this measure will be unfavourable

Paragraph (a) of the proviso to section 37 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to substitute —

Instrument not duly stamped inadmissible in evidence, etc 37 No instrument chargeable with duty shall be admitted in evidence for any purpose by any person having by law or consent of parties authority to receive evidence or shall be acted upon, registered or authenticated by any such person or by any public officer, unless such instrument is duly stamped

Provided that—

(a) Any such instrument not being an instrument charge able with duty of ten cents or twenty cents only, or a bill of exchange or promissory note, shall, subject to all just exceptions, be admitted in evidence on payment of the duty with which the same is chargeable, or, in the case of an instrument insufficiently stamped, of the amount required to make up such duty, together with a penalty of one pound, or, when ten times the amount of the proper duty or deficient portion thereof exceeds one pound, of a sum equal to ten times such duty or portion

A Bill to Amend the Stamp Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Stamp (Amend-Short title ment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Ordinance (Chapter 57 of the Revised Edition), here- Cap 57 inafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Section 37 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by deleting therefrom paragraph (a) of the proviso section 37 of thereto, and substituting therefor the following—

the Principal Ordinance

"(a) any such instrument, not being an instrument chargeable with duty of ten cents or twenty cents only (other than a cheque) or a bill of exchange (other than a bill of exchange presented for acceptance, accepted or payable elsewhere than in the Colony) or a promissory note, shall, subject to all just exceptions, be admitted in evidence on payment of the duty with which the same is chargeable, or, in the case of an instrument insufficiently stamped, of the amount required to make up such duty, together with a penalty of one pound, or, when ten times the amount of the proper duty or deficient portion thereof exceeds one pound, of a sum equal to ten times such duty or portion,"

Section 2 of the Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, Repeal of section 1937, is hereby repealed

2 of Ordinance No 6 of 1937 is presented for acceptance or accepted, or payable outside the Colony shall not be invalid by reason only that it is not stamped in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, and any such bill of exchange which is unstamped or not properly stamped may be received in evidence on payment of the proper duty and penalties prescribed under paragraph (a) of this section

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 2 of the Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, purported to give effect to certain International Conventions regarding the admissibility in evidence of cheques and bills of exchange which were either unstamped or understamped

The Conventions, as adhered to by this Colony, required an amendment to the Stamp law making admissible, on payment of the duty and penalty, all such cheques and bills of exchange provided the latter were presented for acceptance accepted, or payable outside the Colony

The amendment, however, as passed into law, by including cheques within the term "bill of exchange", excludes cheques payable in the Colony from the benefits of the Convention

It is, therefore, proposed to repeal section 2 of the Stamp (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, and to amend the Principal Ordinance on the lines adopted in Tanganyika Territory

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
