Power of commanding officer

Sub-paragraph A (g) of paragraph (1) of section 46 of the Principal Ordinance, which it is proposed to delete —

46 The commanding officer shall, upon an investigation being had of a charge made against a person subject to this Ordinance of having committed an offence under this Ordinance, dismiss the charge, if he in his discretion thinks that it ought not to be proceeded with, but where he thinks the charge ought to be proceeded with, he may take steps for bringing the offender to a court-martial or in the case of a soldier or a follower he may deal with the case summarily

Where he deals with the case summarily—

- (1) If the offender is a soldier not being a non-commissioned officer, the commanding officer may —
- A—Save in the case of absence without leave or of drunkenness, impose on the offender any one or more of the following punishments—
 - (g) Award corporal punishment not exceeding twenty strokes in lieu of or in addition to other punishment under this section, provided that, unless the offender be on active service, corporal punishment shall not be awarded except for offences committed on the line of march against the persons or property of the

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Clause 2 of this Bill deletes the provision which empowers Commanding Officers to award corporal punishment to African soldiers, as it is considered advisable that this power shall, in future, be confined to courts martial

Clause 3 transfers to the Brigade Commander the power of discharging a locally enlisted British warrant or non-commissioned officer which is at present vested in the Commanding Officer, and includes inefficiency as one of the grounds on which such British warrant or non-commissioned officer may be discharged

Clause 4 transfers from the King's African Rifles Regulations to the Ordinance authority for payment of gratuities to soldiers who have been awarded the long service and good conduct medal

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

New tables and instructions not to apply to pensions payable before 1st July, 1736

5 This Ordinance shall have effect as from the first day of July, 1936, and shall apply to any pension payable in respect of a contributor dying on or after that date, but not to any pension payable in respect of a contributor dying before that date in which case the Tables and Instructions repealed and replaced by this Ordinance shall continue to apply

A Bill to Amend the Widows' and Orphans' Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows' and Short title Orphans' Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Widows' and Orphans' Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1937, hereinafter referred to as the No 3 of 1937 Principal Ordinance

2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by substituting a colon for the full stop which section 5 appears at the end thereof, and by adding, immediately after Principal such colon, the following proviso —

Ordinance

"Provided that where the operation of the Tables included in this Ordinance would have the effect of reducing the amount of any pension payable in respect of an officer who is a contributor at, and who married before the 1st day of July, 1936, the Tables repealed and replaced by this Ordinance shall continue to apply as if this Ordinance had not been enacted"

OBJECTS AND REASONS

It has been found that the application of the new tables introduced in Ordinance No III of 1937 to some officers who joined the scheme as bachelors and married after reaching the age of 49 is prejudicial to them and that it would be to their advantage if the position had remained as it was before the enactment of the Ordinance referred to

The proviso now proposed is intended to safeguard the position of those officers The expenditure of public money which will be involved if the provisions of this Ordinance become law will be negligible
