

The charge for an ordinary call shall be calculated from the time the caller's telephone number is placed in communication with the telephone number specified by the caller

The charge for a person to person call shall be calculated from the time the caller is placed in communication with the person specified by him or a substitute acceptable by the caller

- 2 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the authority, and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint.
